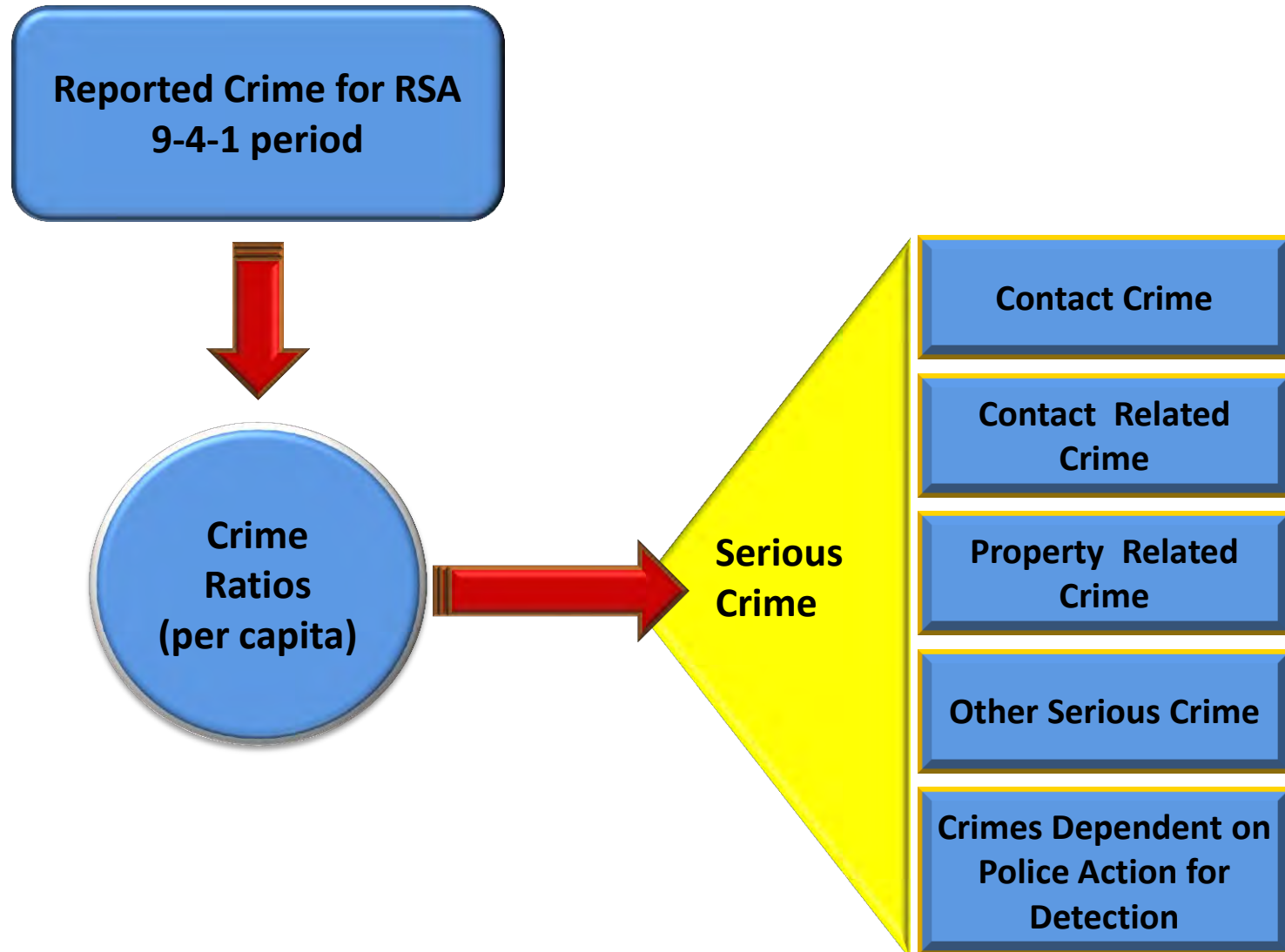
Introductory Remarks...

- Our democratic government has invested enormously in the policing environment:
 - Total Personnel Strength: 197 946 (SAPS Act = 155 531) with a comparative police vs population ratio of 1:336
 - Improved vehicle vs personnel ratio of 1:3.83 (51713 vehicles for 197 946 members)
 - There are 1 132 police stations serving as fixed police-community contact points for service delivery
 - The current budget is about R63bn
 - Quality training continues to be a critical offering
- Government initiatives and the criminal justice system (JCPS) to fight crime is plausible
- Over the past 9 years (2004/5 to 2012/13) crime continues to decline against the increase in population figures
- There are specific crimes that continue to persist over the same period
- The escalating number of public unrest also draws local members conducting basic policing to support public policing and strains resources

...Introductory Remarks

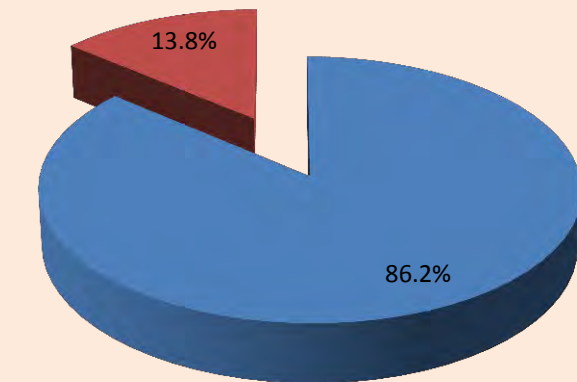
- Additional and dedicated resources are required to capacitate Public Order Police to meet these challenges and relieve visible policing constraints (basic policing)
- Success in public order policing is further enhanced by continuously restoring and sustaining stability in the country
- The rural community's access to police services requires creative rural policing partnership initiatives and accessibility models
- Current initiatives include the rollout of Provincial Crime Prevention Strategies and Mine Crime Combatting Forums; and partnerships with the banking sector (SABRIC), business (Business Against Crime), and other critical stakeholders
- The experienced murders of police members and suicides continue to erode the capacity of police to fight crime
- Analysis of crime patterns depicts a discernible correlation between crime and challenging socio-economic conditions
- Violent social behaviour continues to prevail in the majority of serious crime categories, some of which persist to be stubborn and require a collective effort from all affected stakeholders

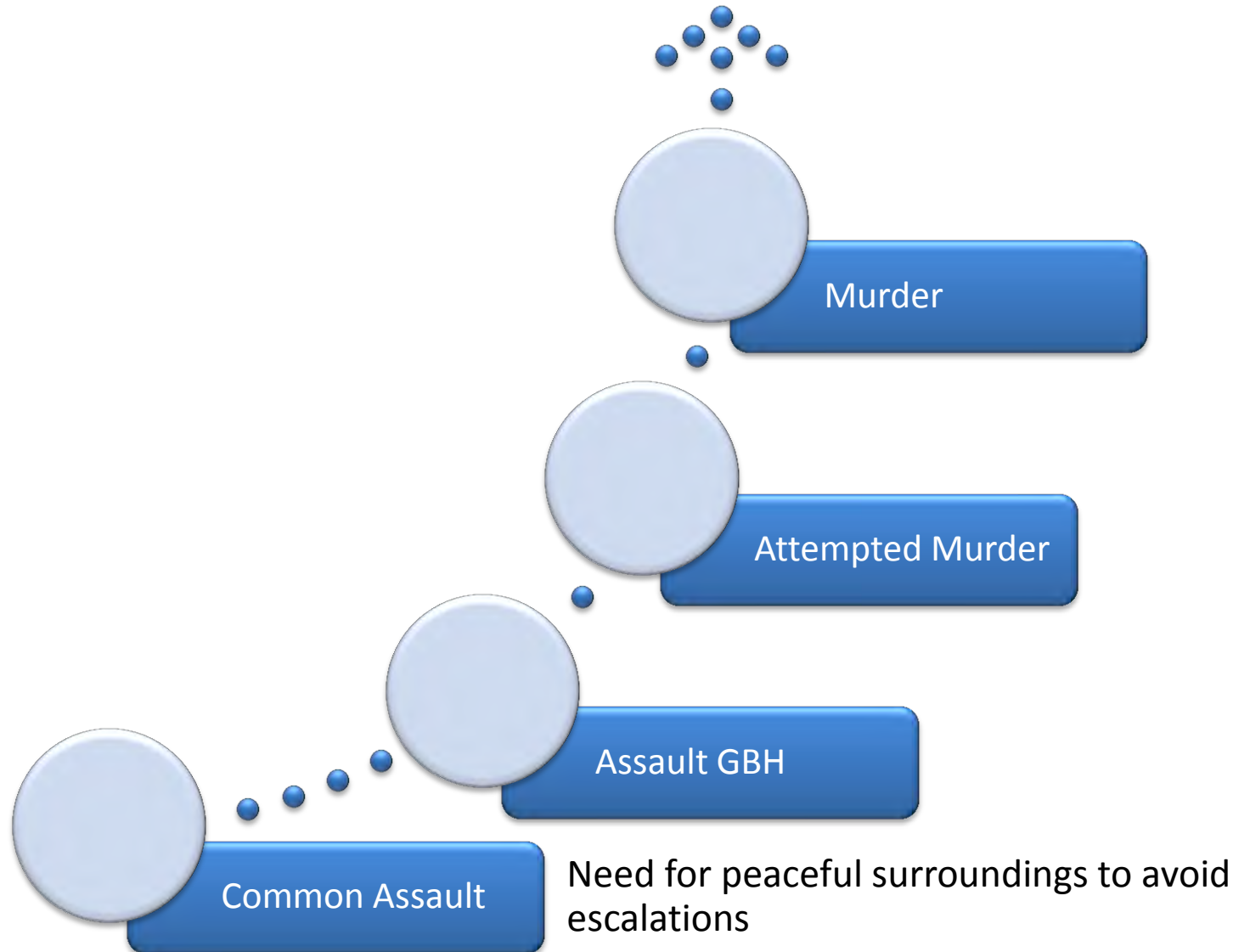

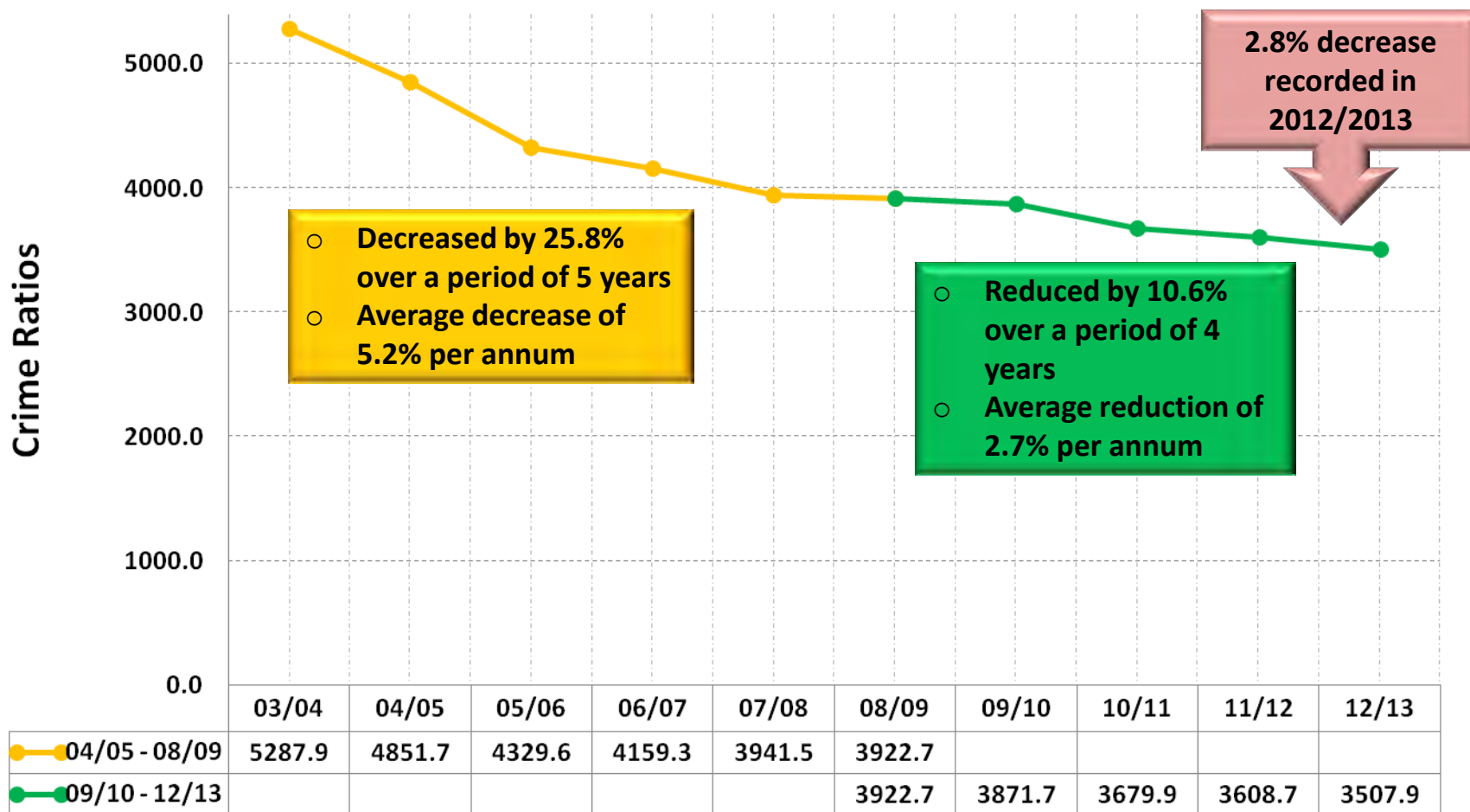

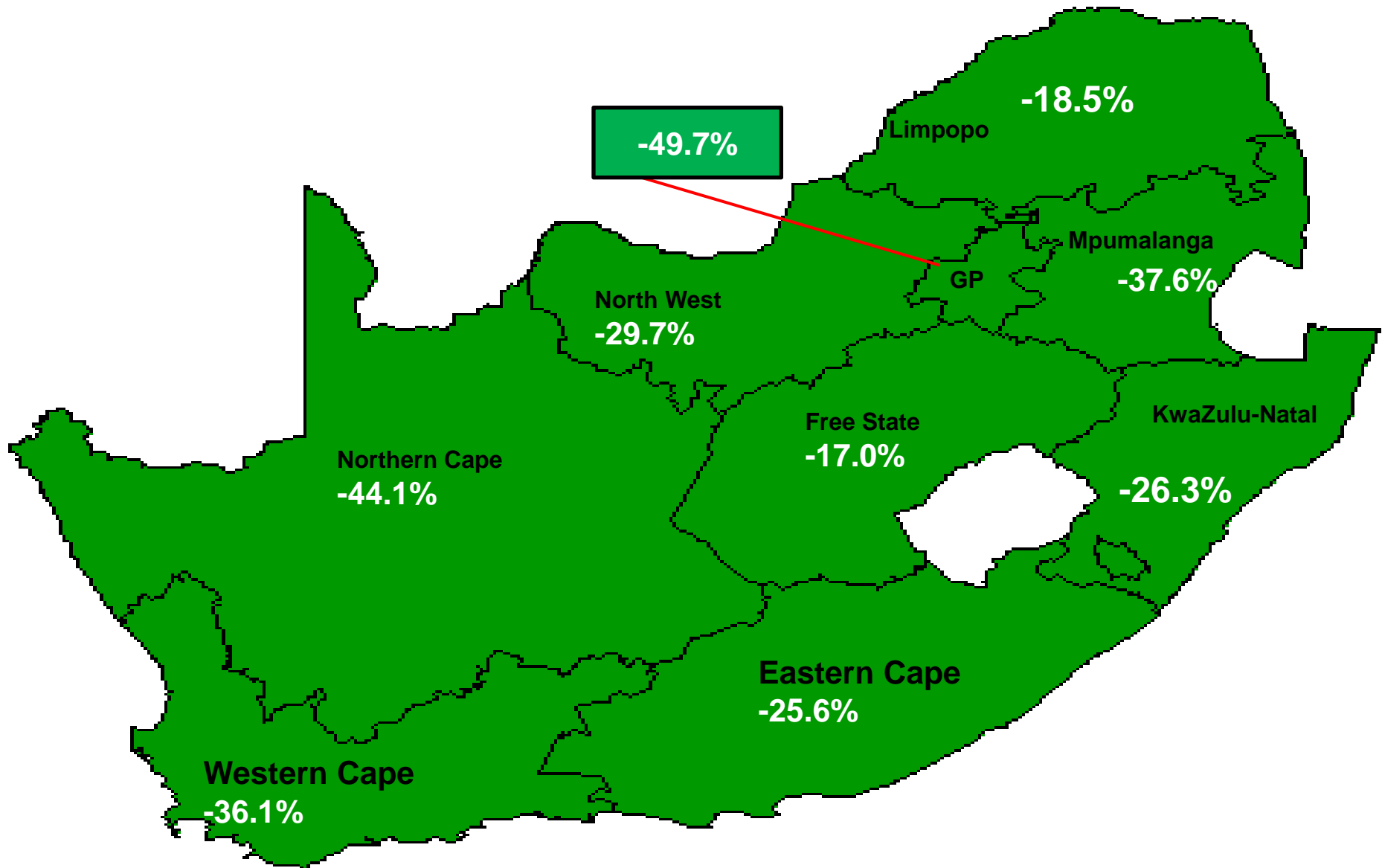

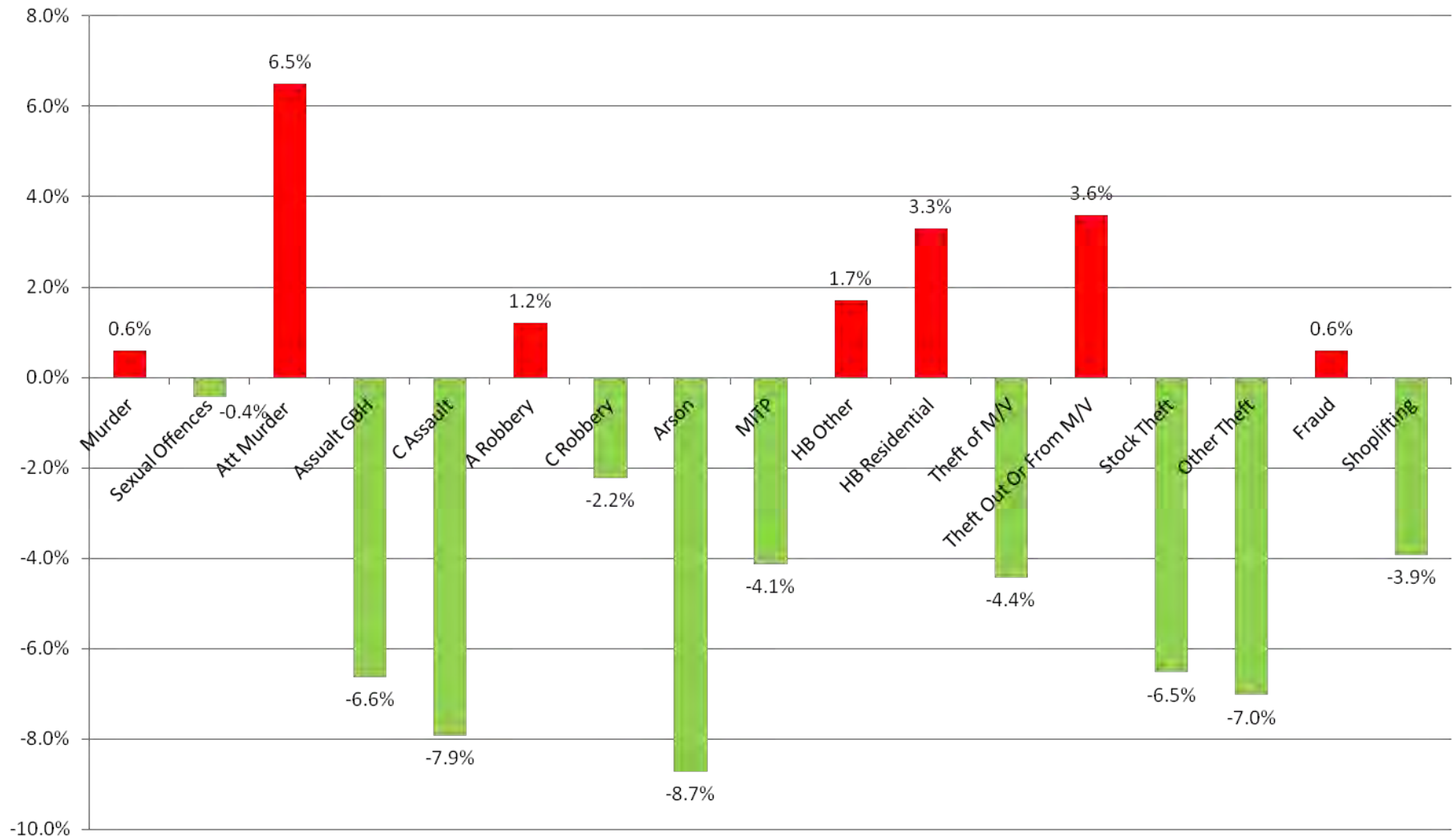

Key Highlights:2012/13

- More than **1.1 million litres** of liquor was confiscated and **92 929** identified illegal liquor premises were closed down during 2011/12 and more than **1.8 million** litres confiscated with **74 547** premises closed in 2012/13
- During the 2011/12 financial year there were **777 140** serious crime arrests effected and **806 298** in 2012/13
- There were **307 580** convictions in 2011/12 and **352 513 convictions** for all serious crime during 2012/13
- **609** offenders were sentenced to **826 life sentences**. FCS accounts for **499** of these life sentences
- **1 586** offenders were sentenced to a combined total of **2006** years imprisonment for serious crimes
- Reported crime figures pertaining to crimes against women and children indicate:
 - In 2009/10 there were **197 877** crimes committed against women in comparison to **175 880** in 2012/13, a decrease of **11.1%**
 - In 2009/10 there were **56 539** crimes committed against children in comparison to **49 550** in 2012/13, a decrease of **12.4%**

 - Destruction – **119 810** firearms destructed in 2011/12 and **56 051** in 2012/13

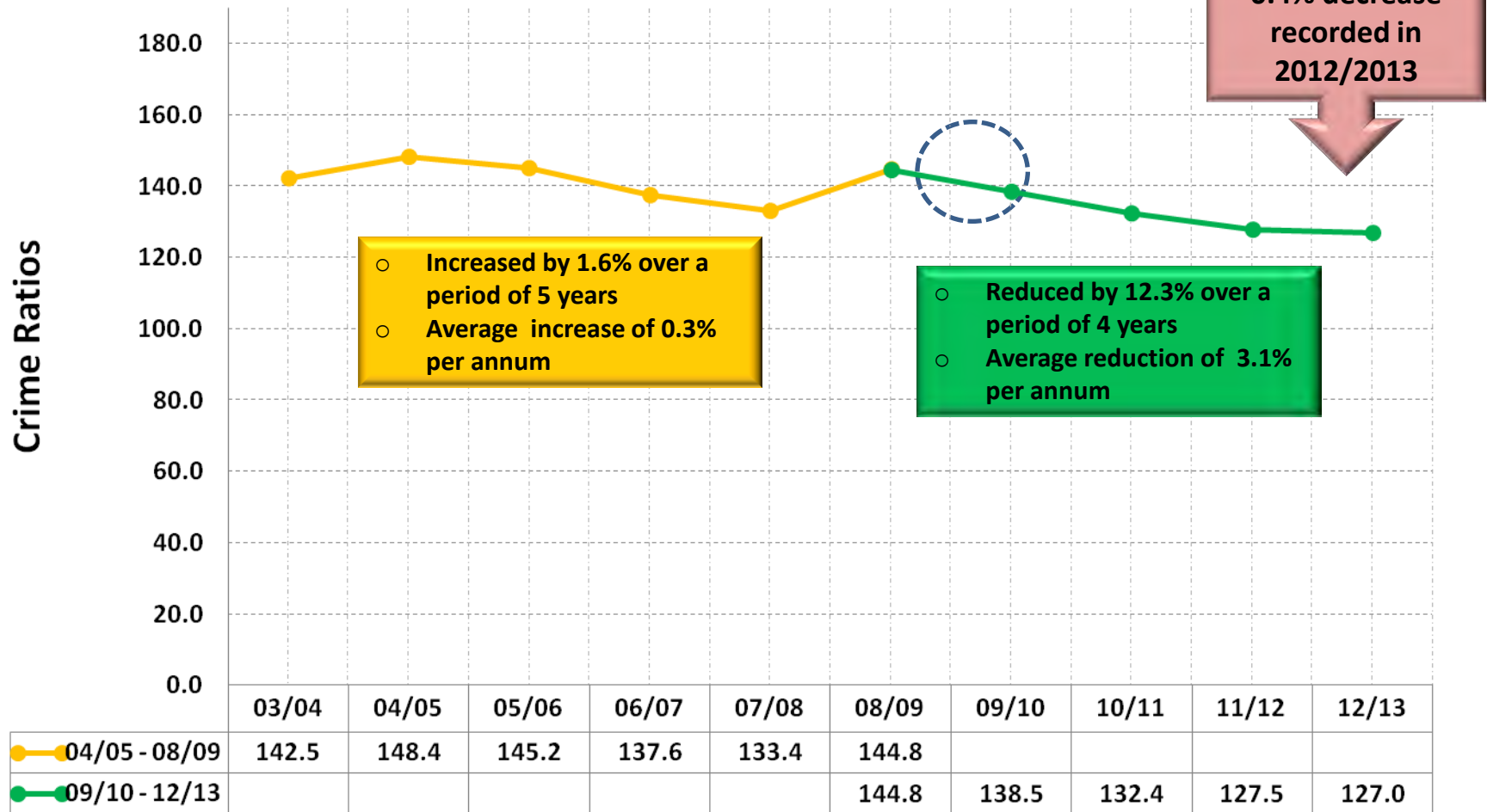

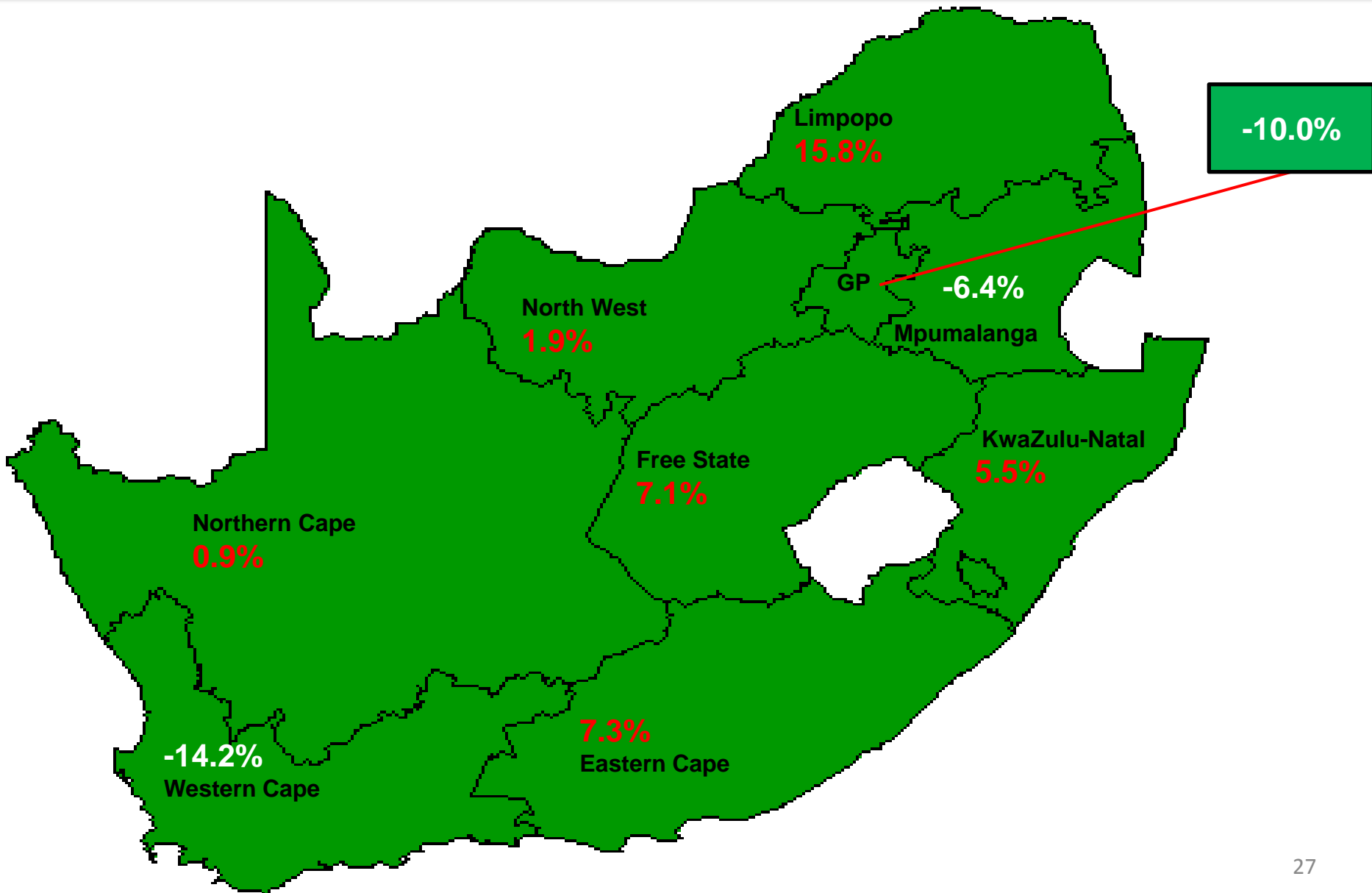

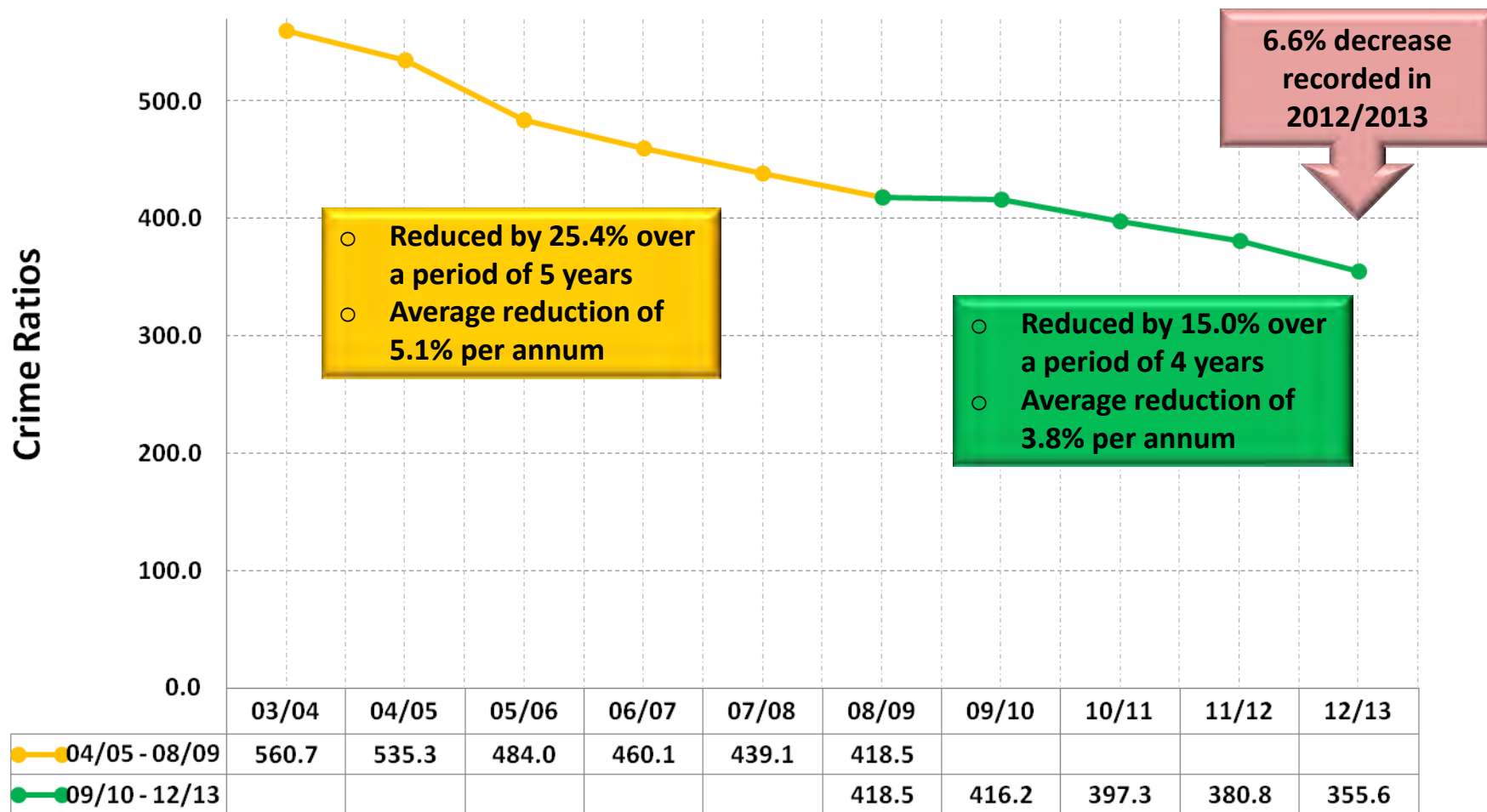

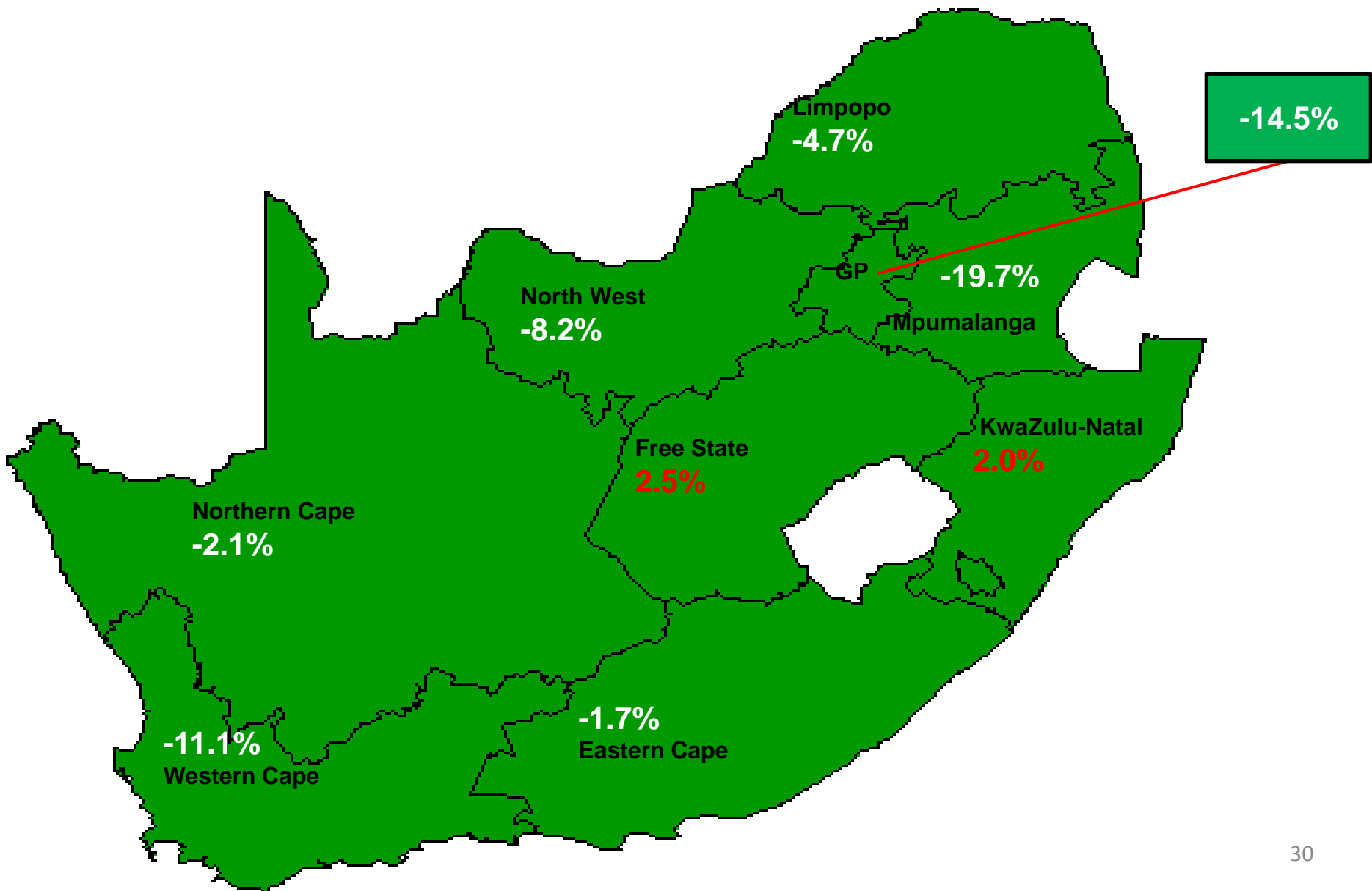

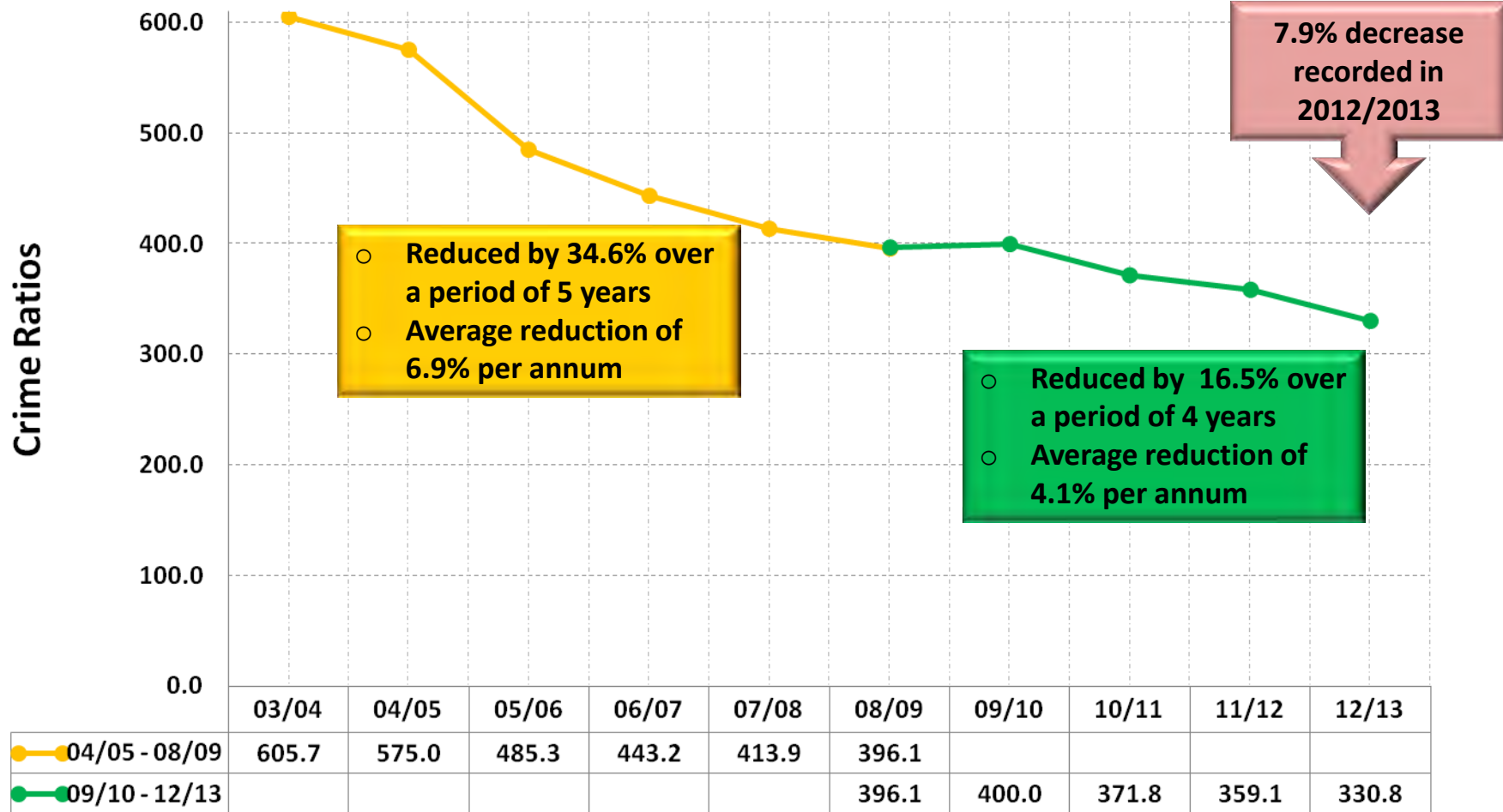

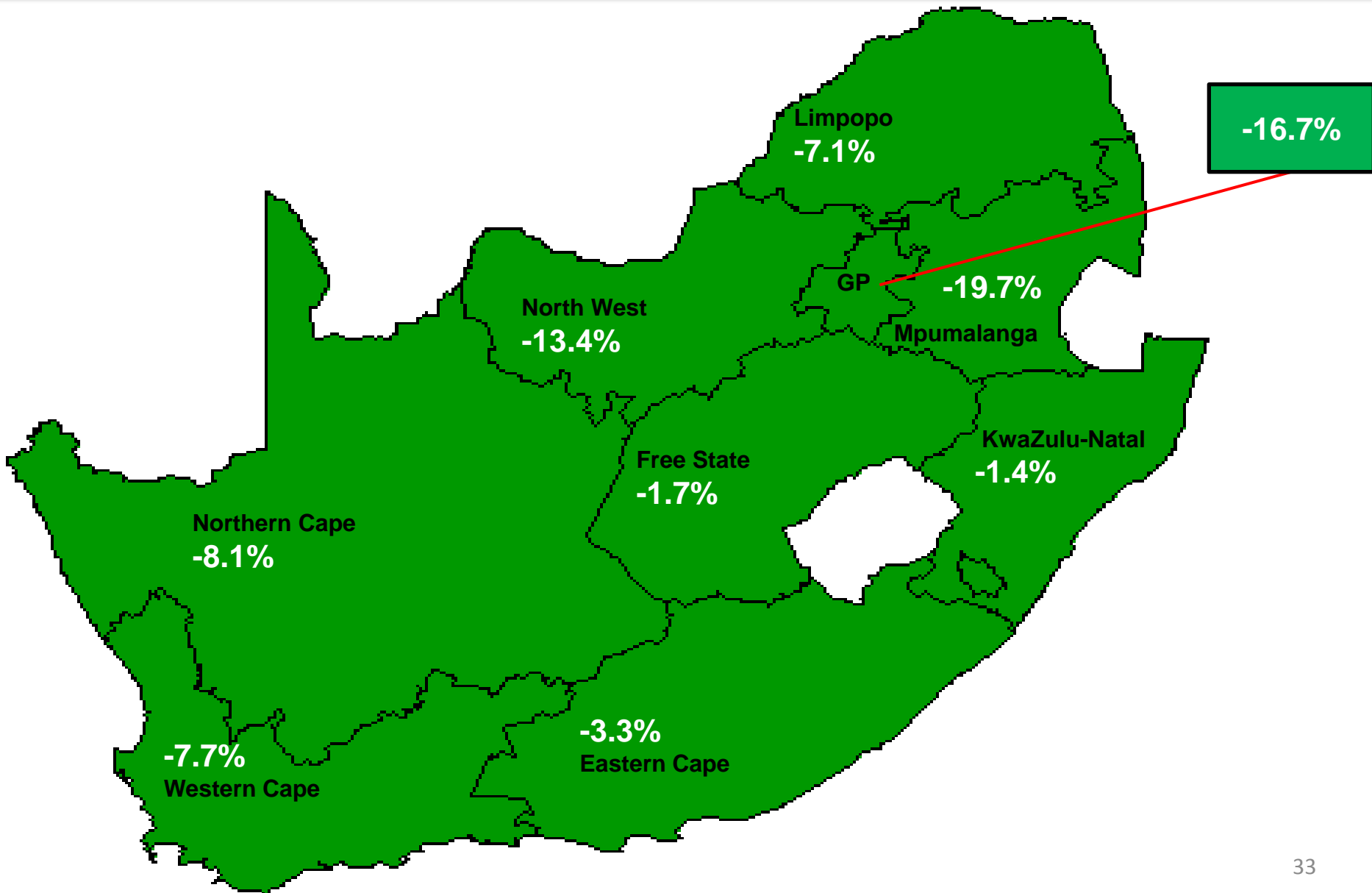

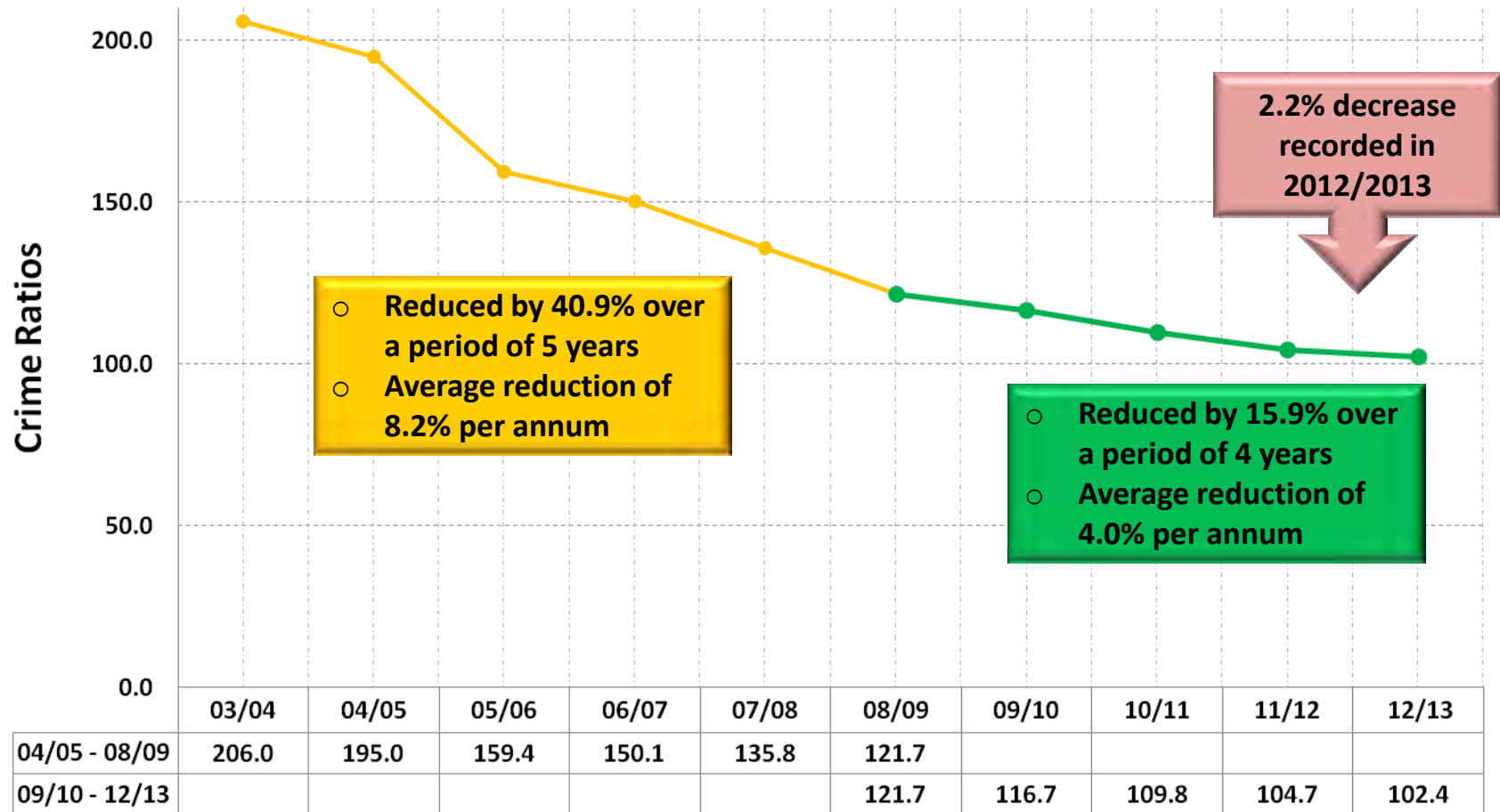

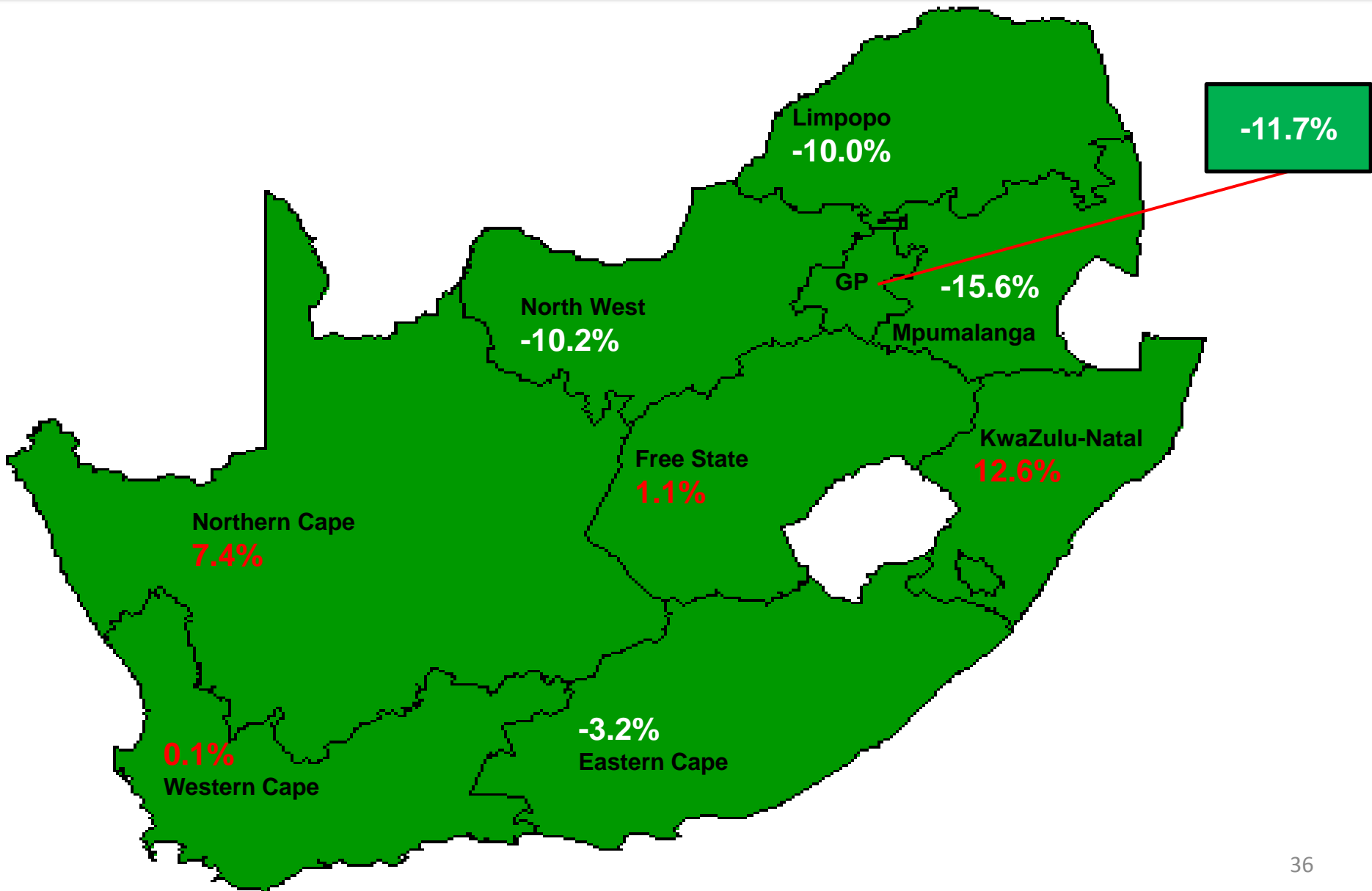

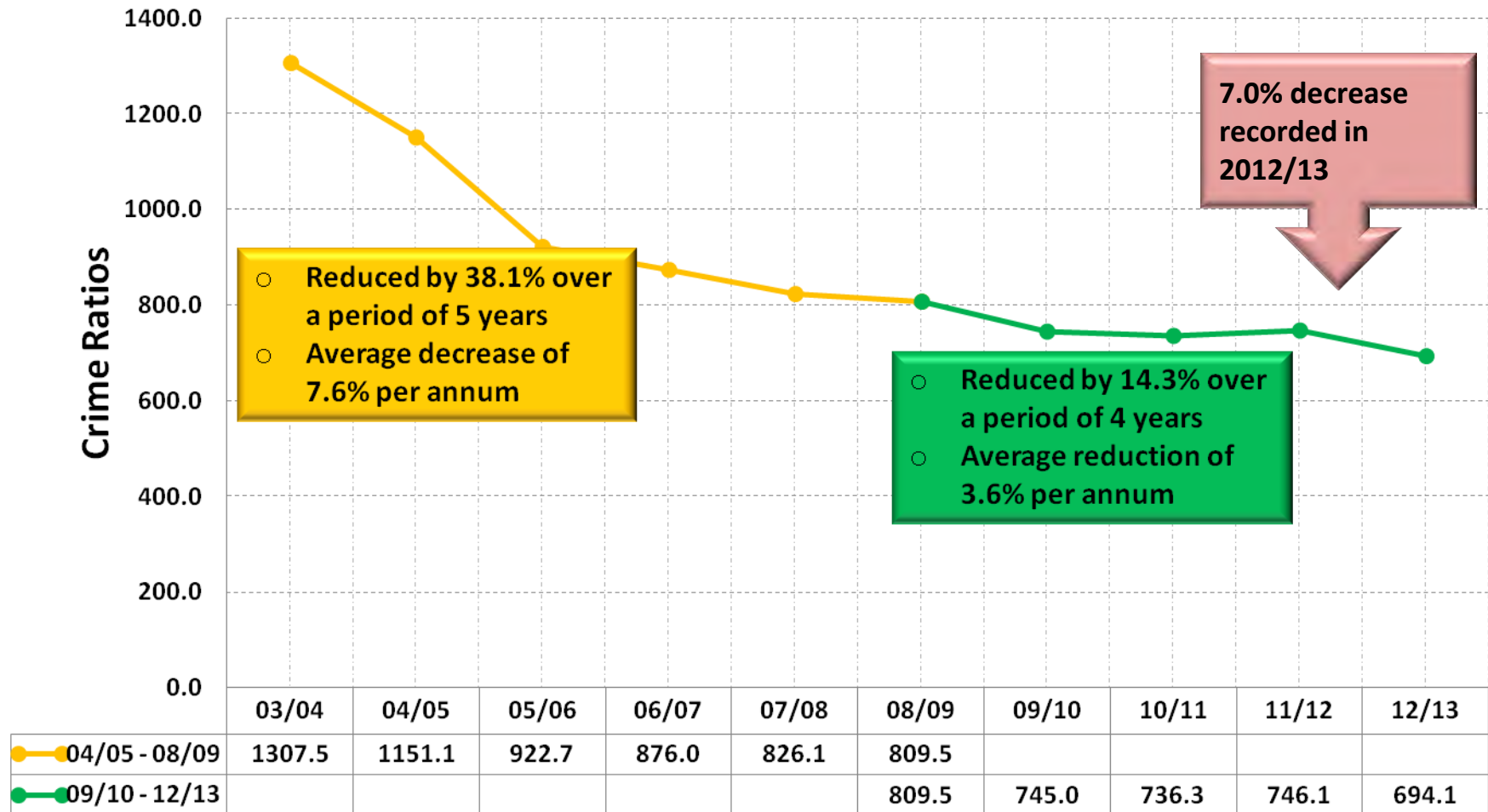

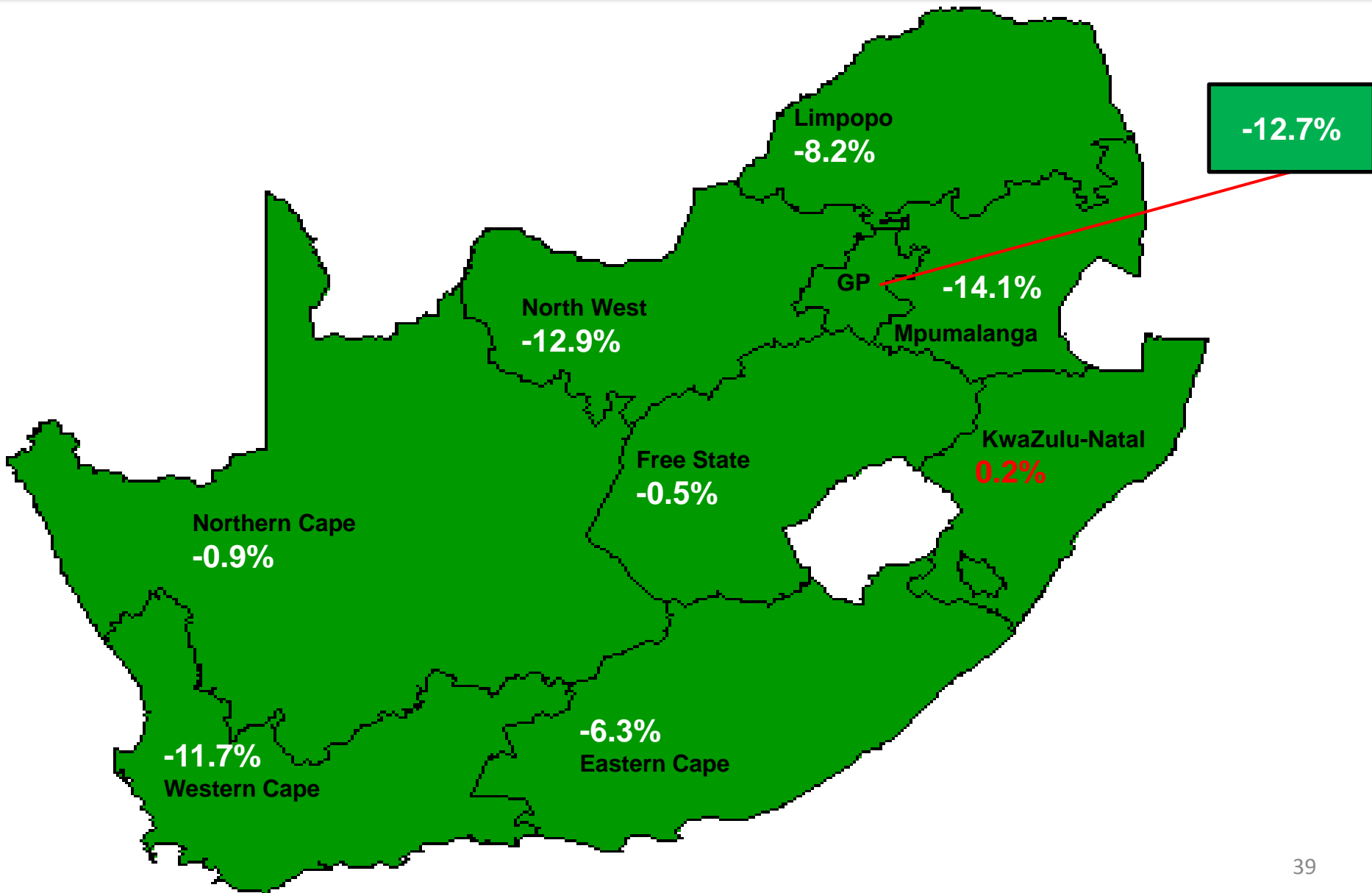

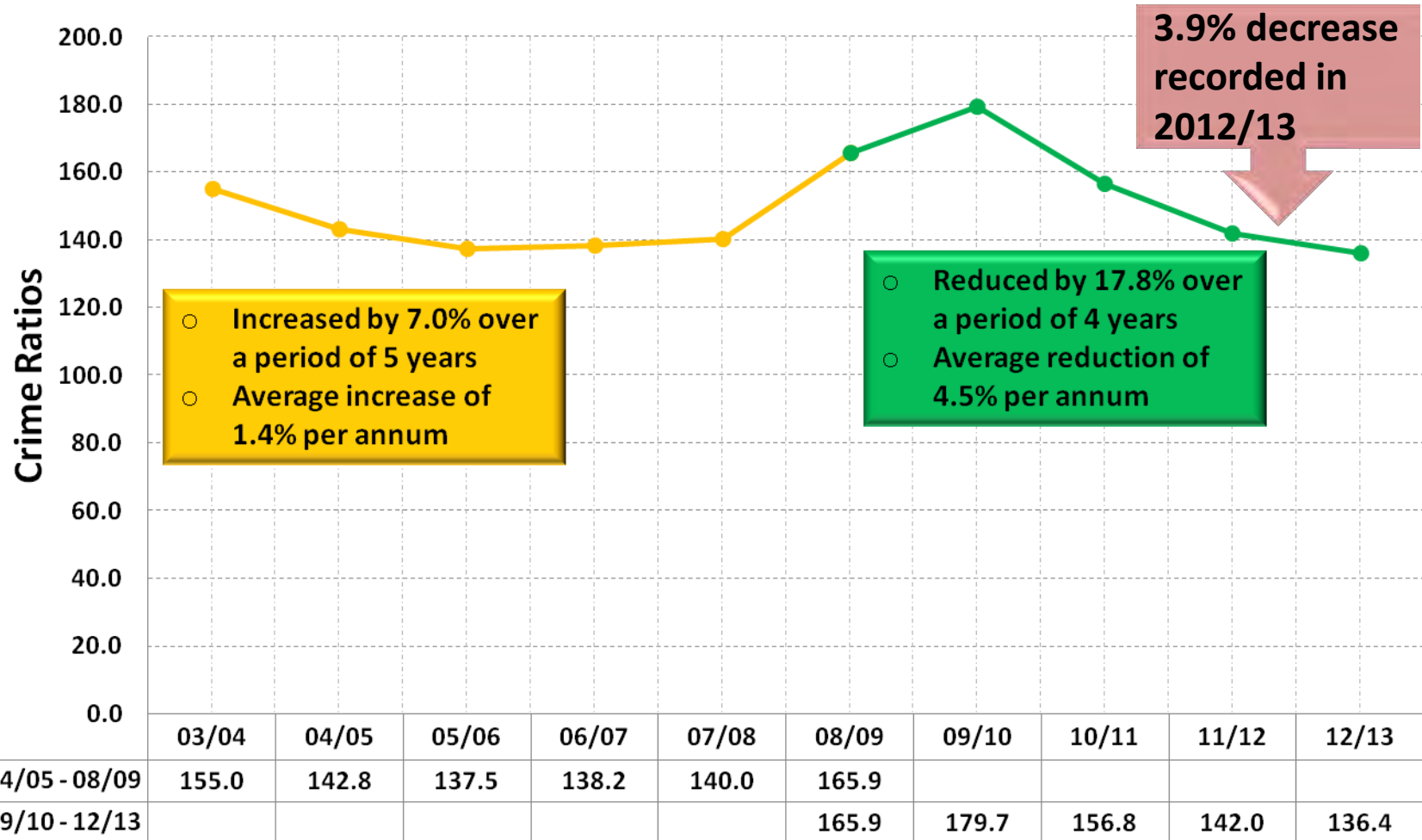

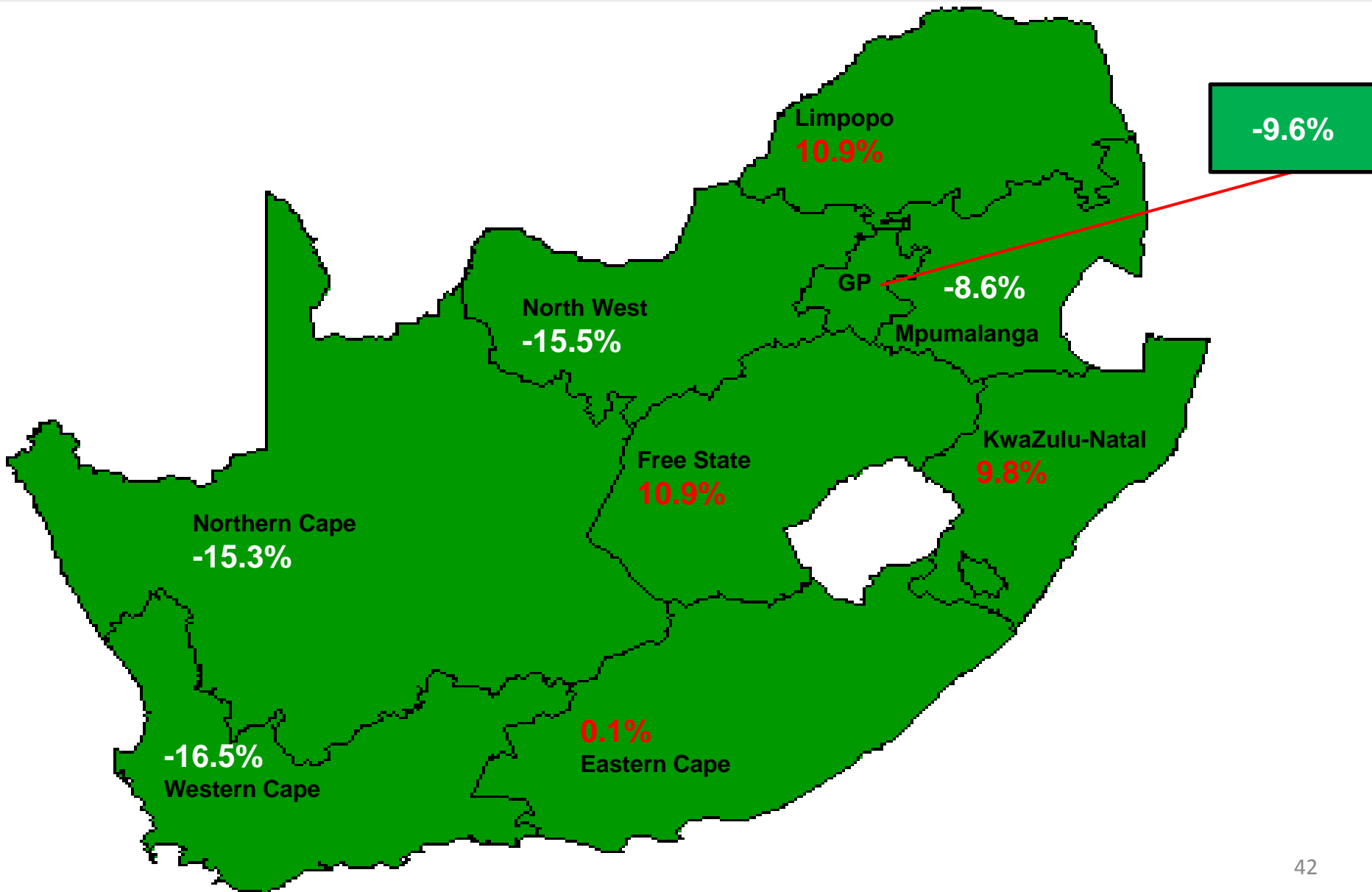

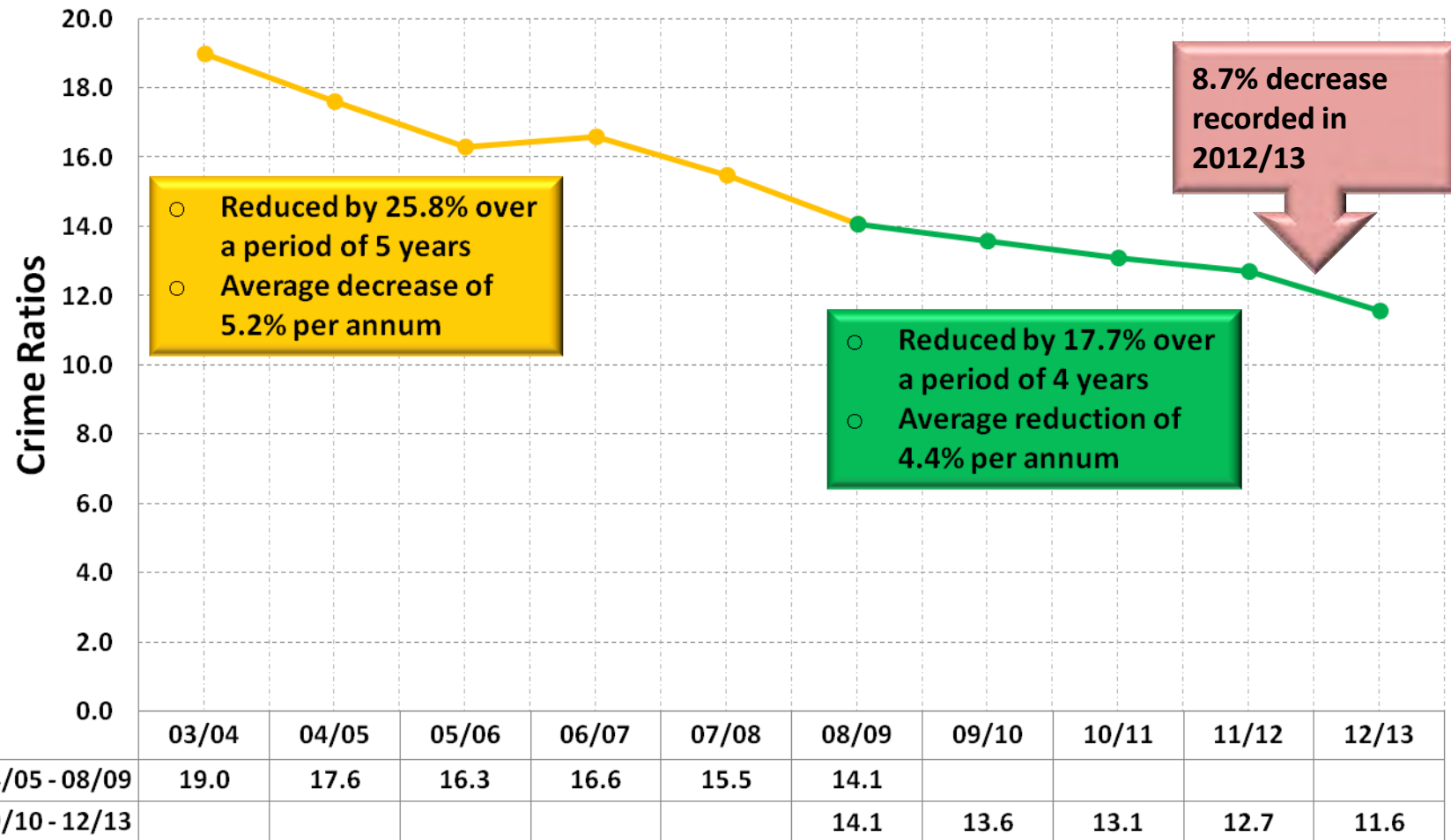

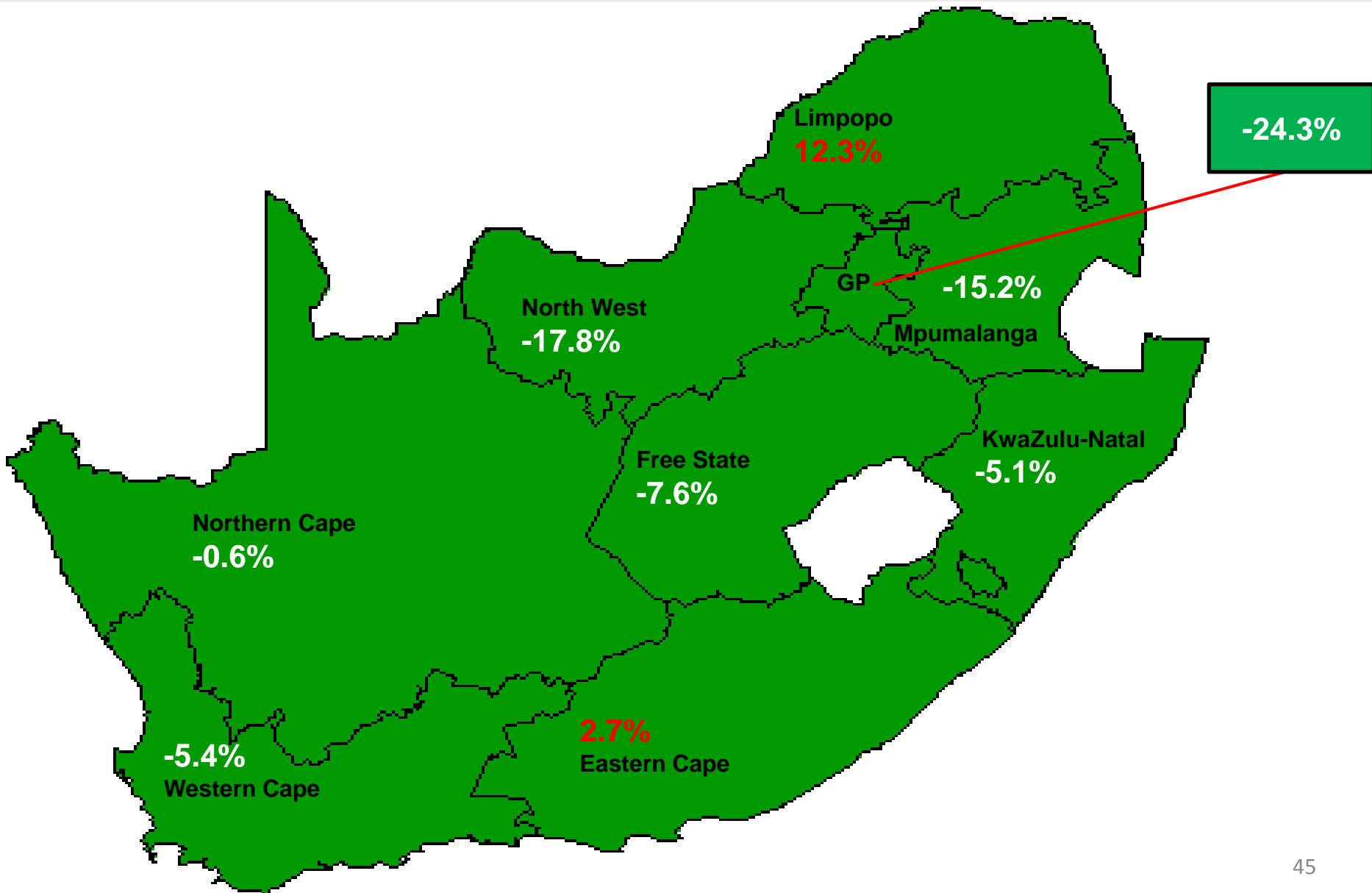

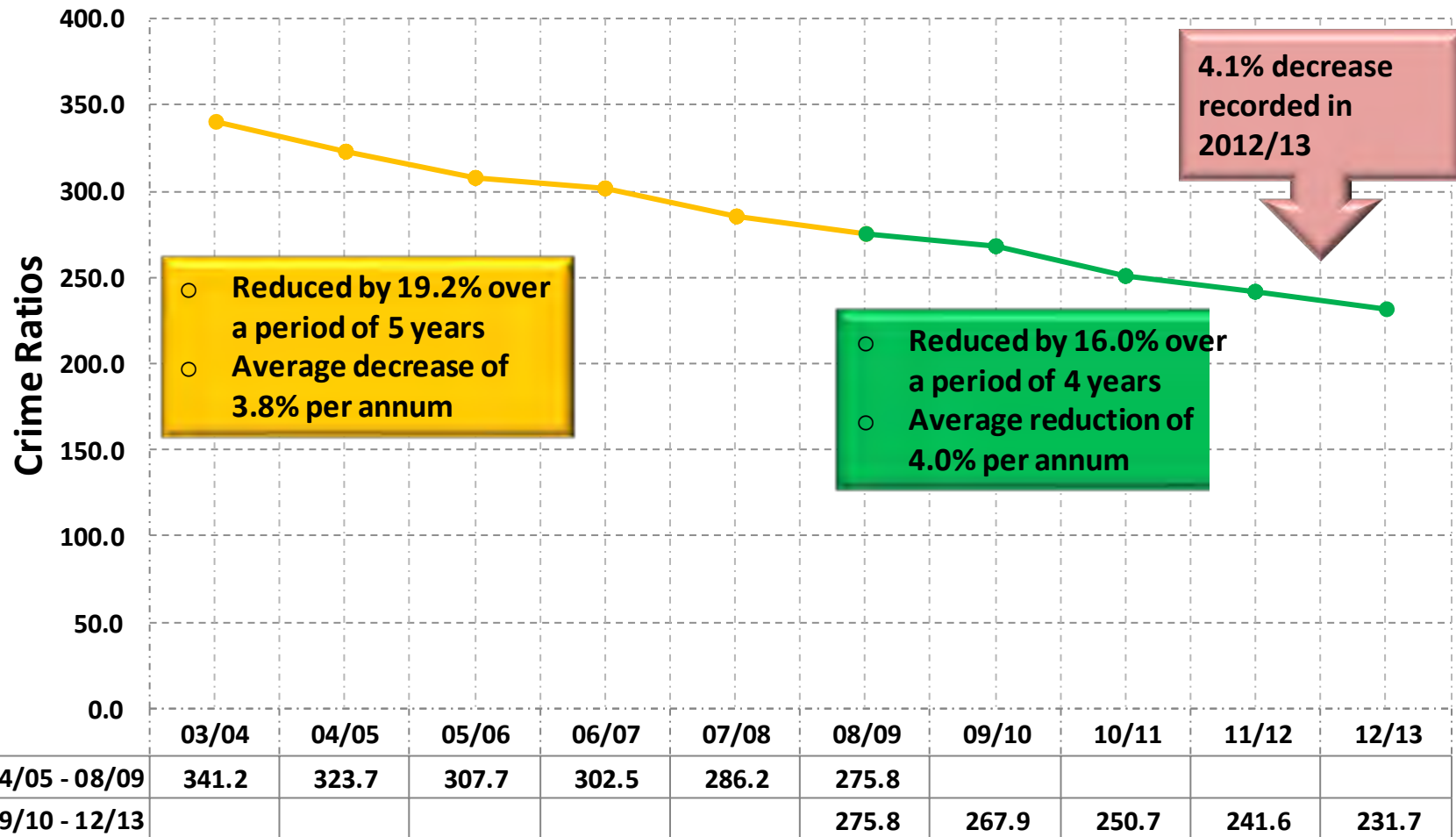

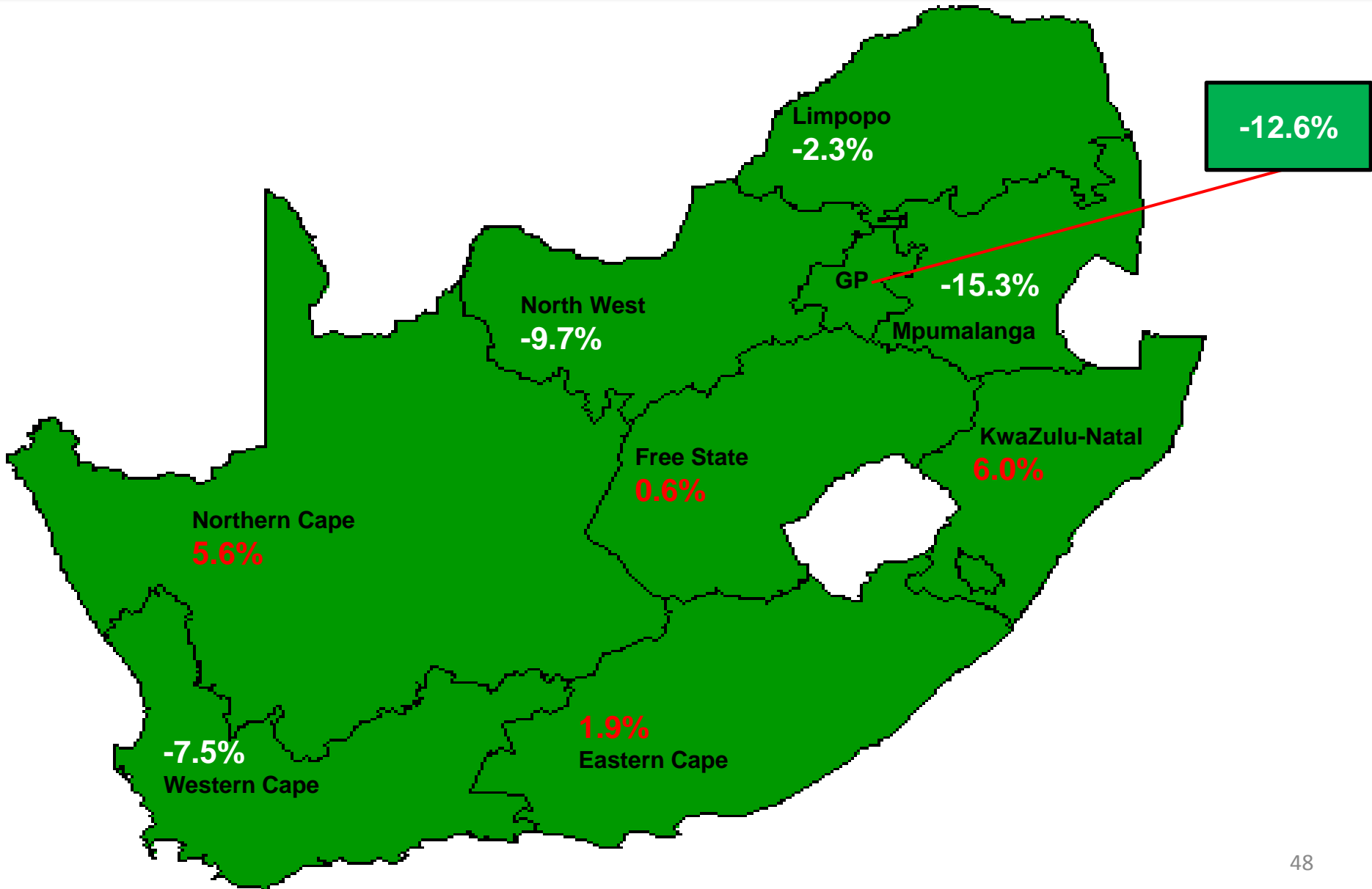

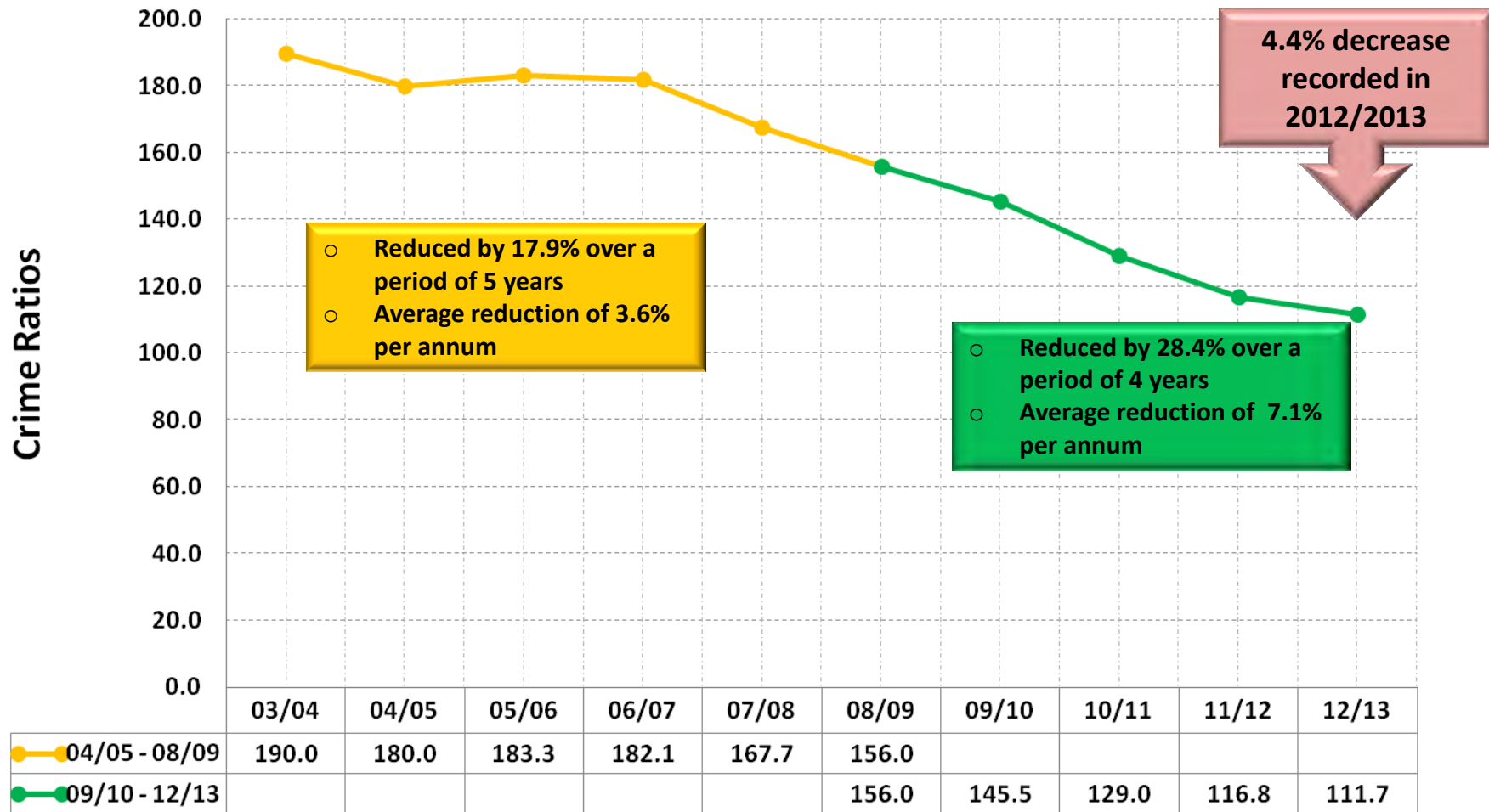

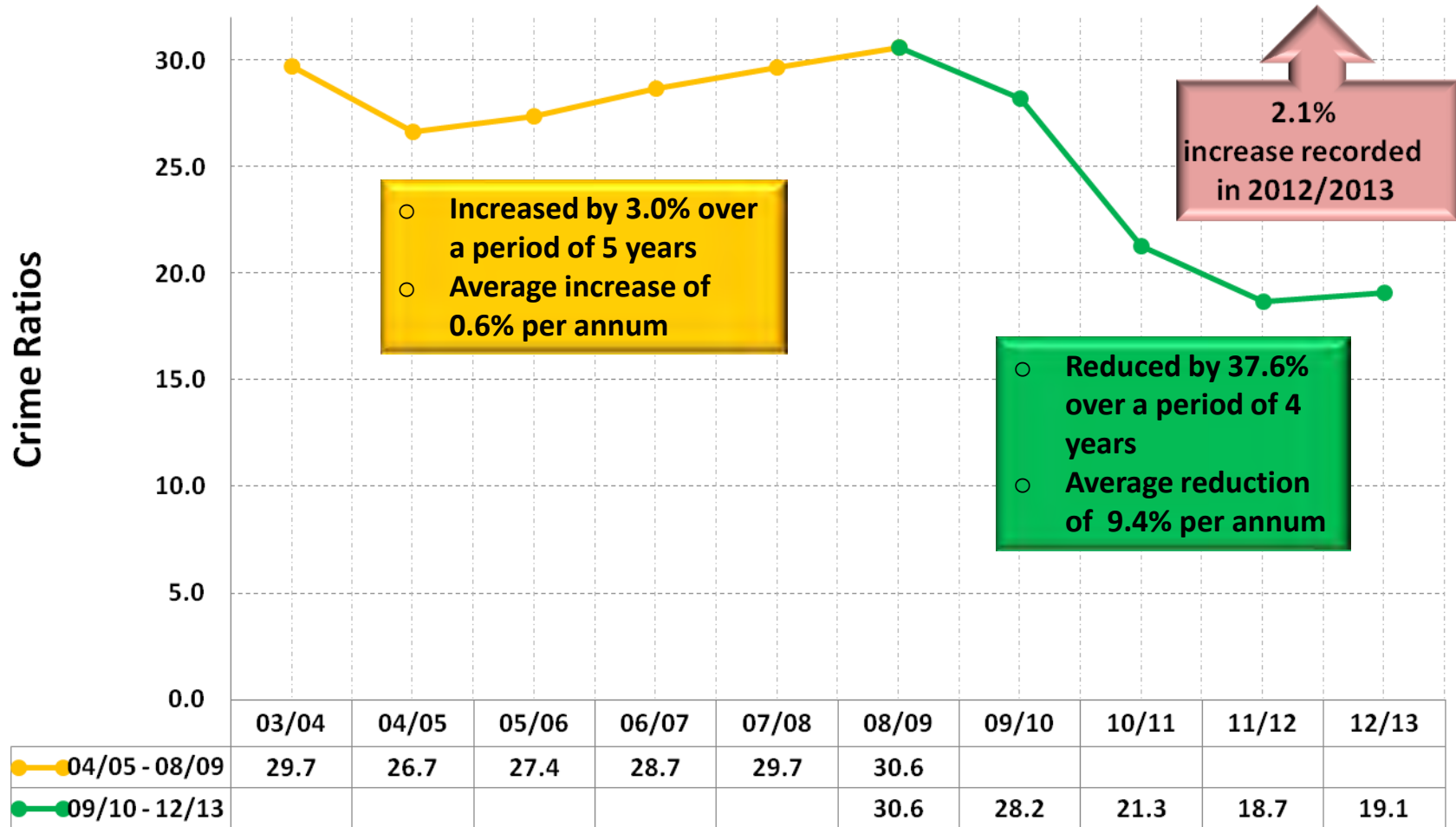

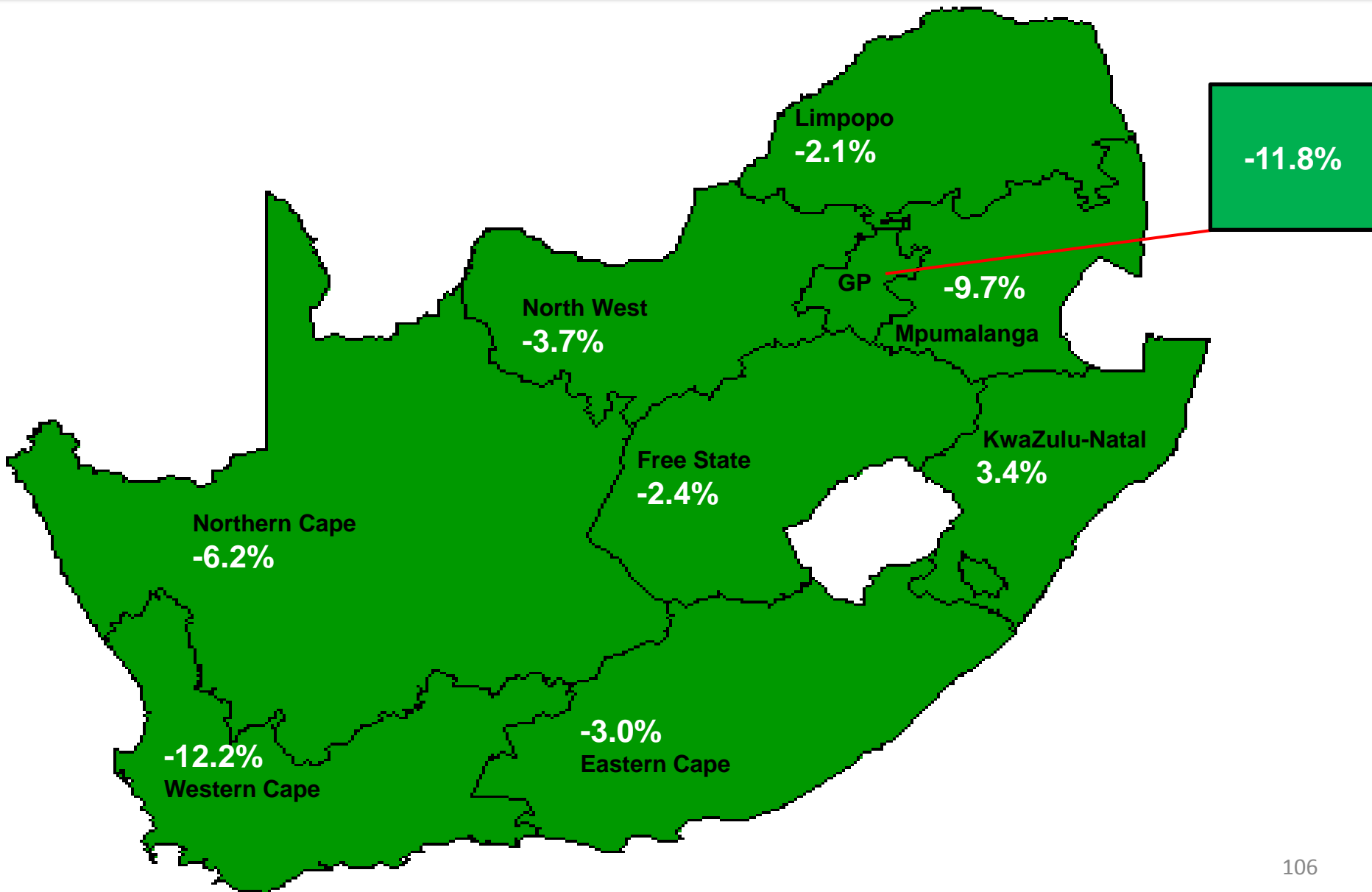

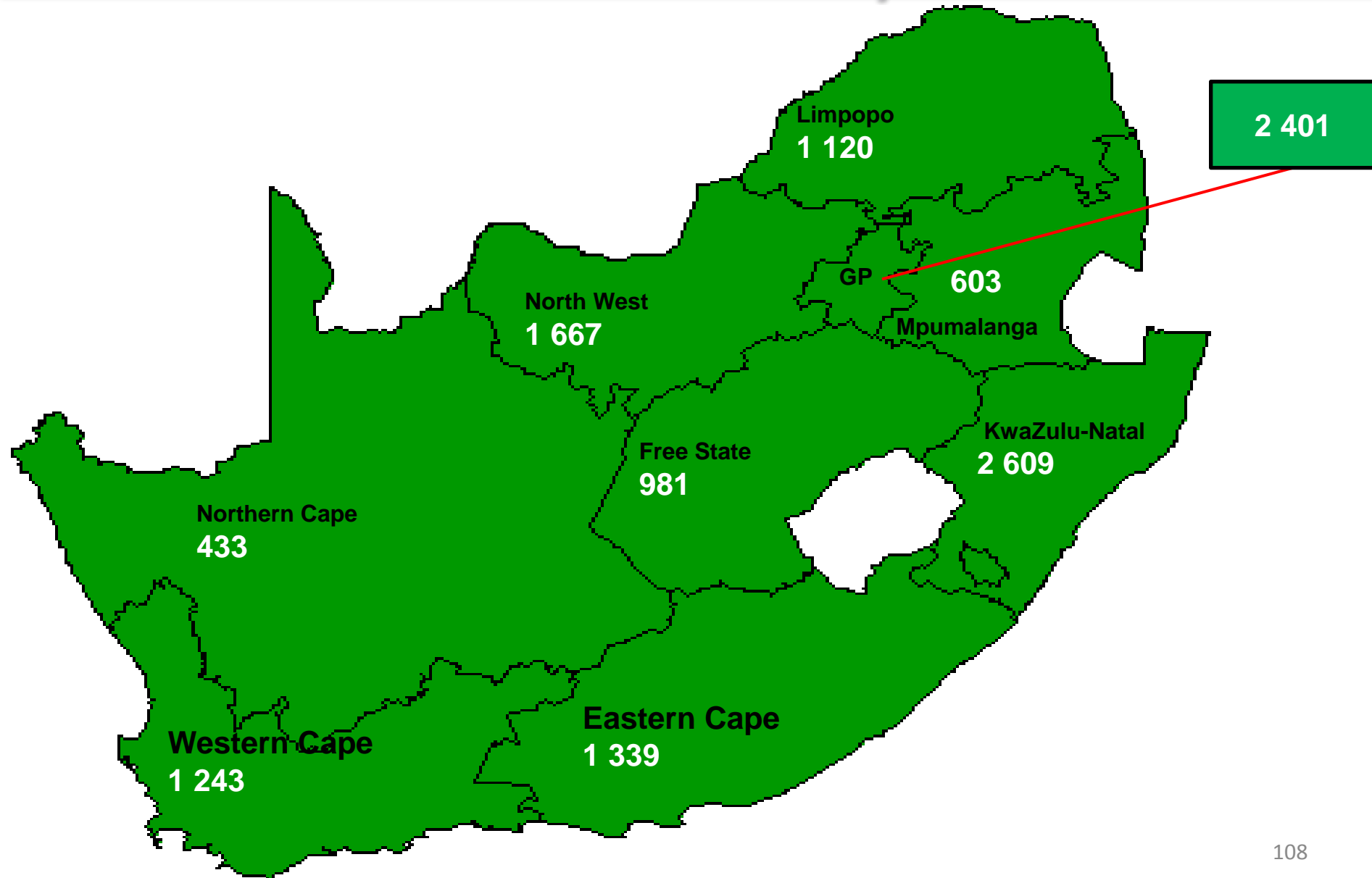


Unrest and peaceful related incidents

From 1 April 2009 to 31 March 2013

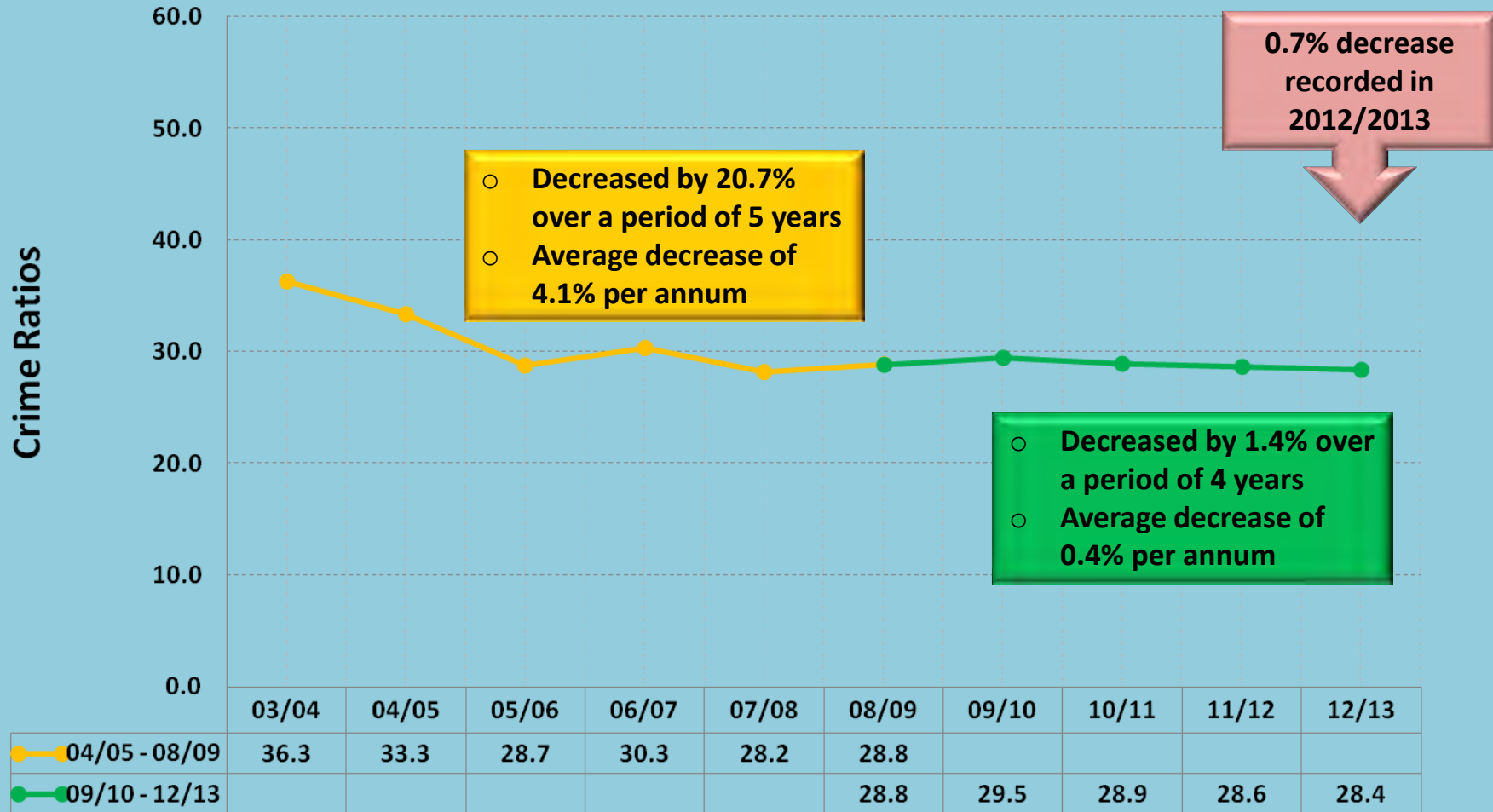


Plotting public order policing incidences:2012/13



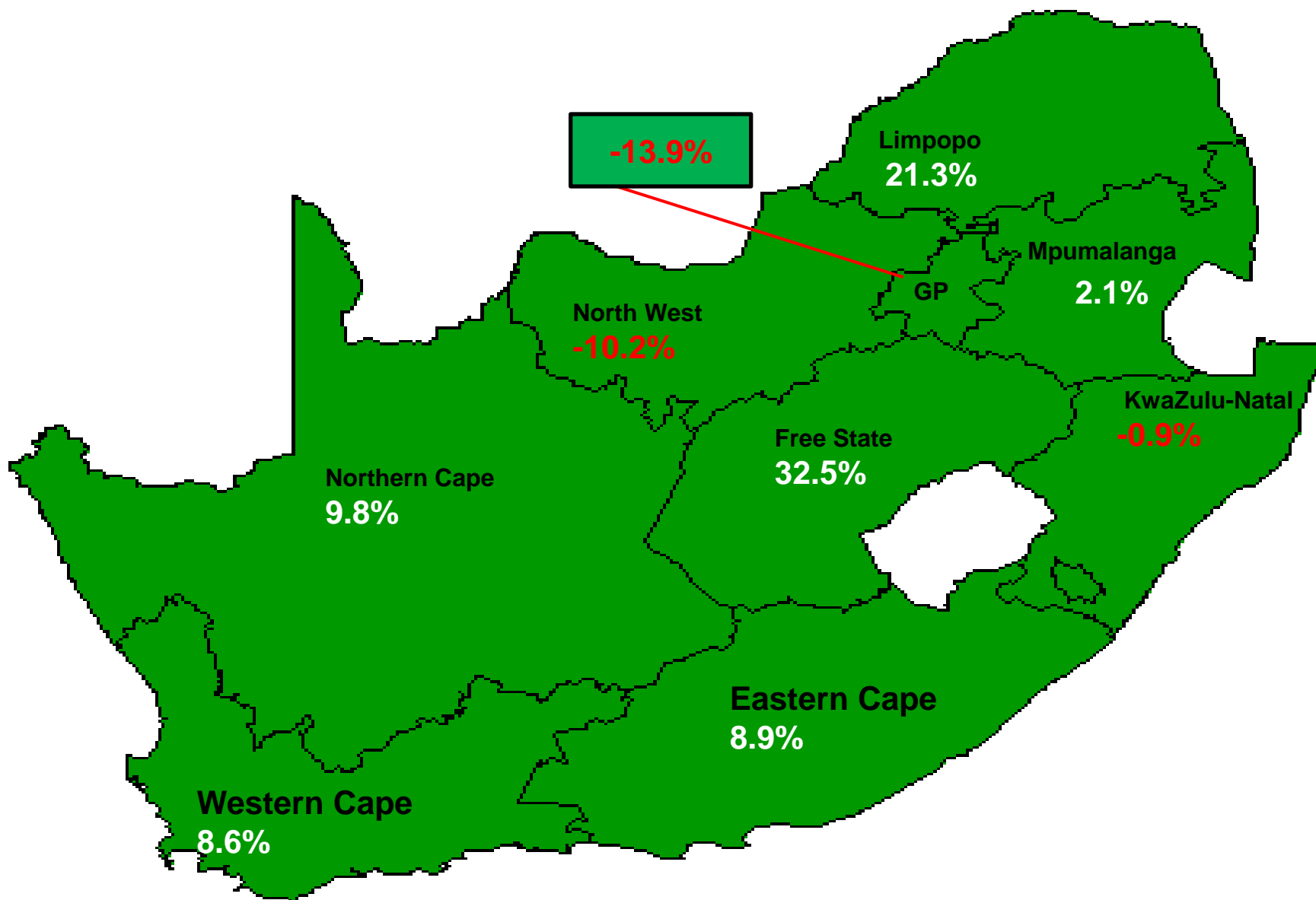

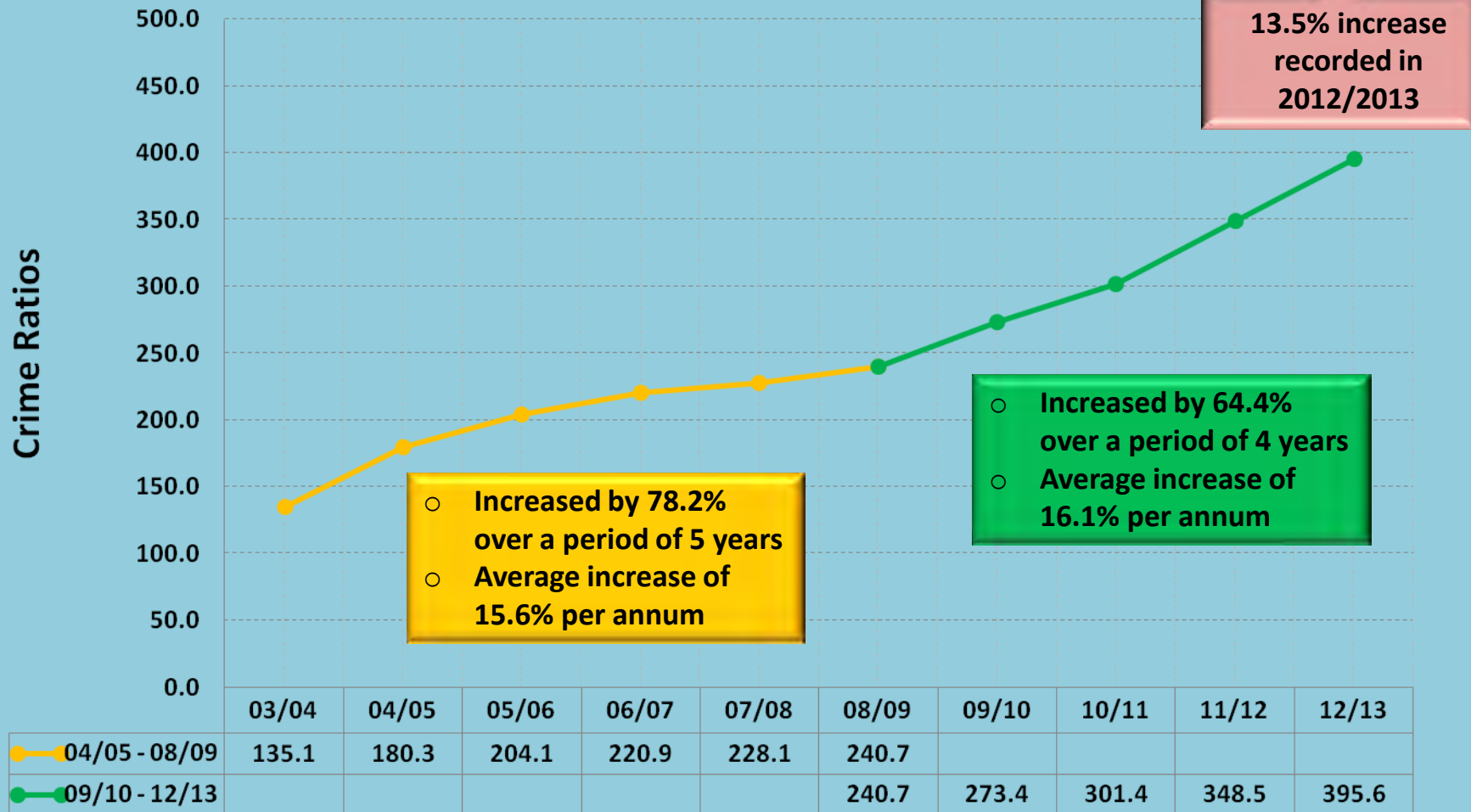

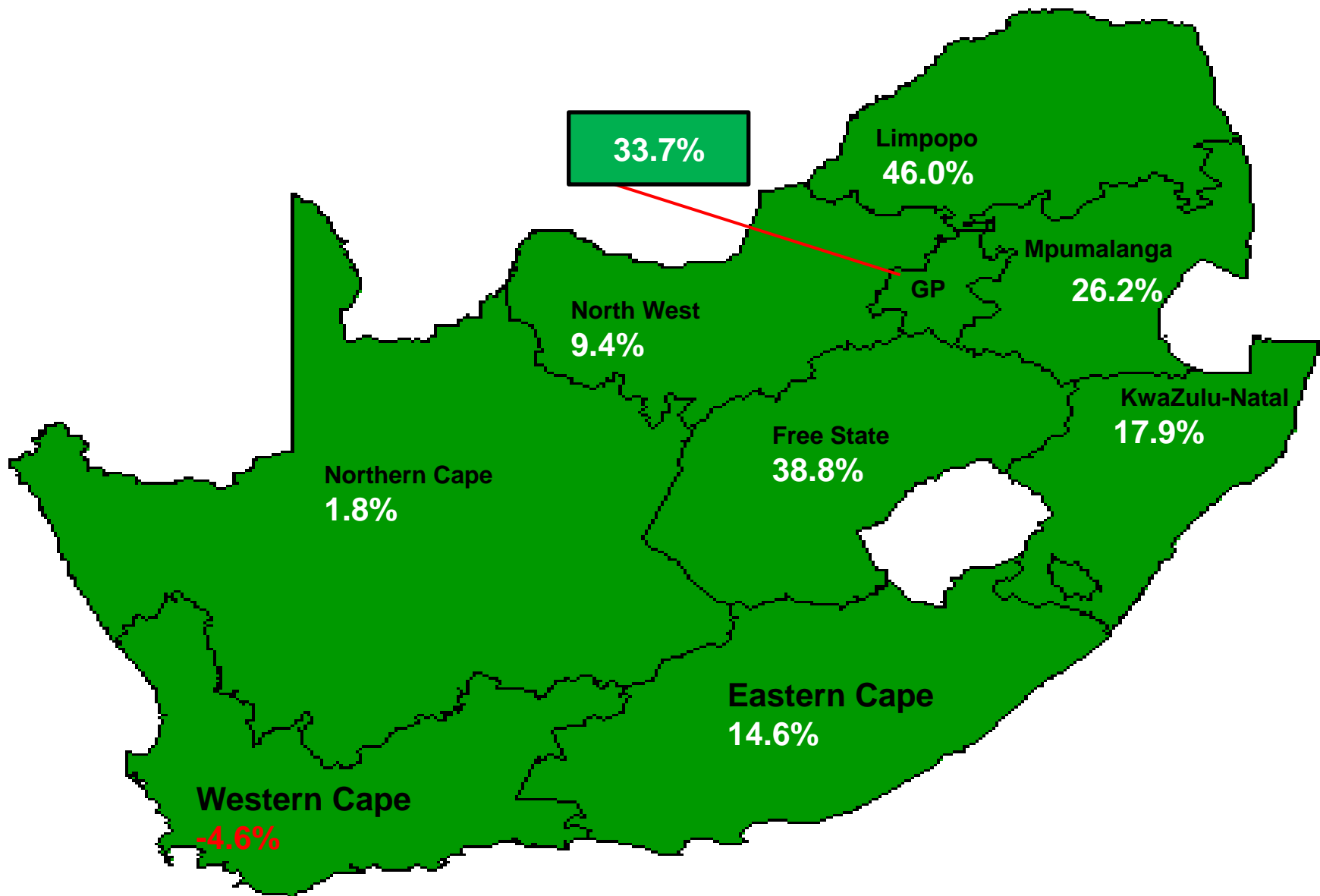
Drug Related Crime:2012/13

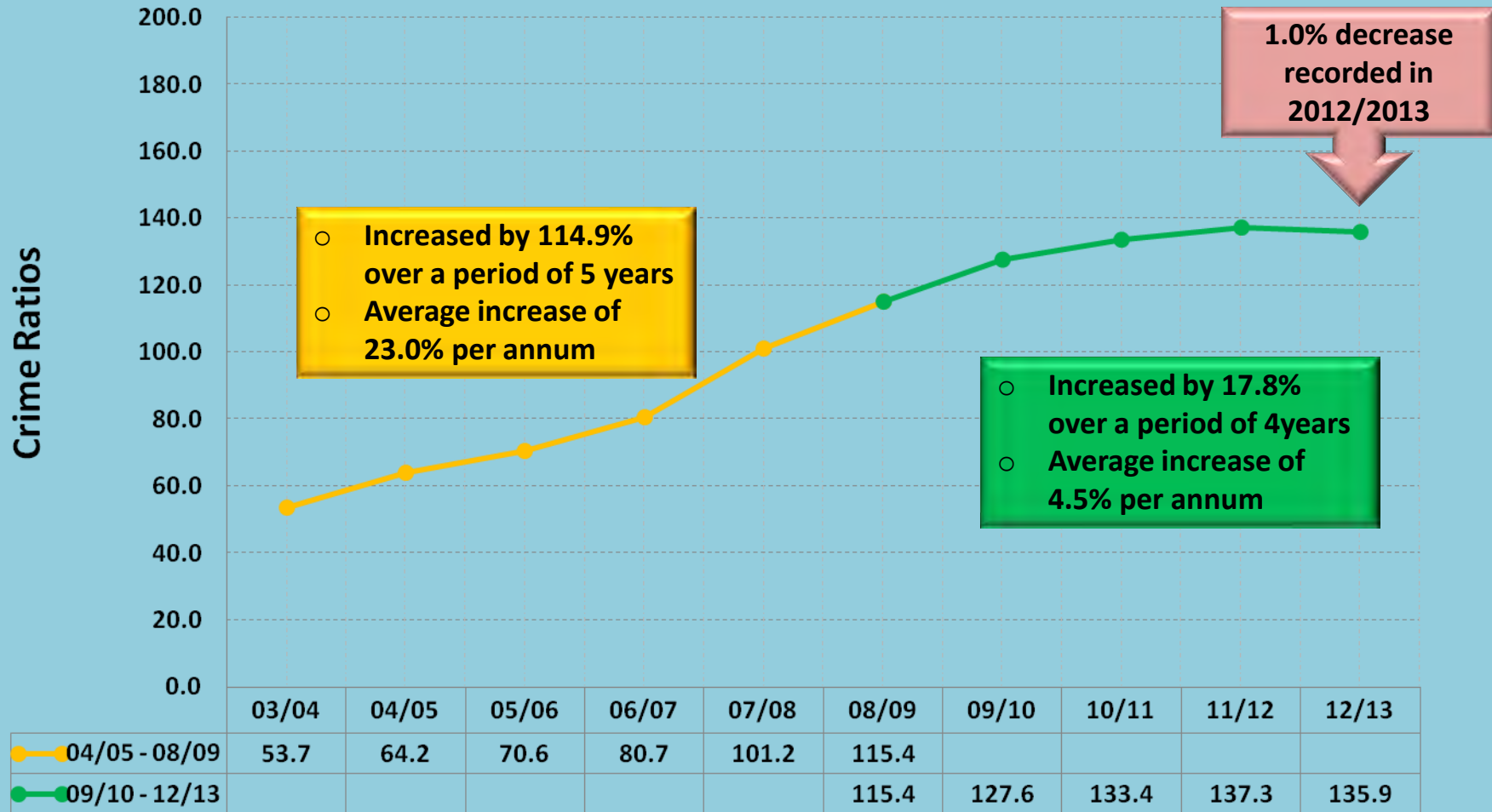
Drug-related crime increased by 192.8% from 2004/5 to 2012/13 (9 years)

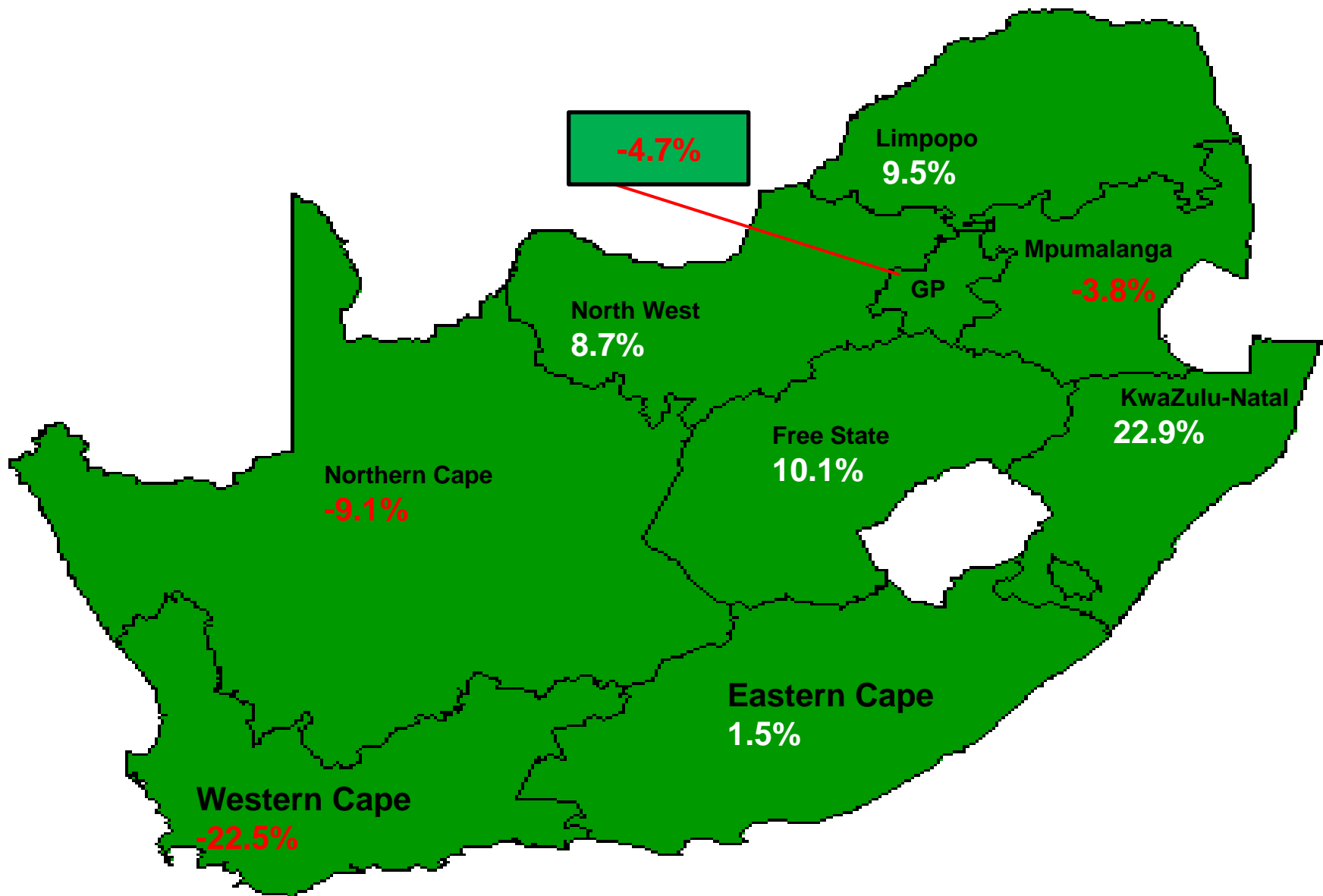
Driving Under Influence: 2012/13

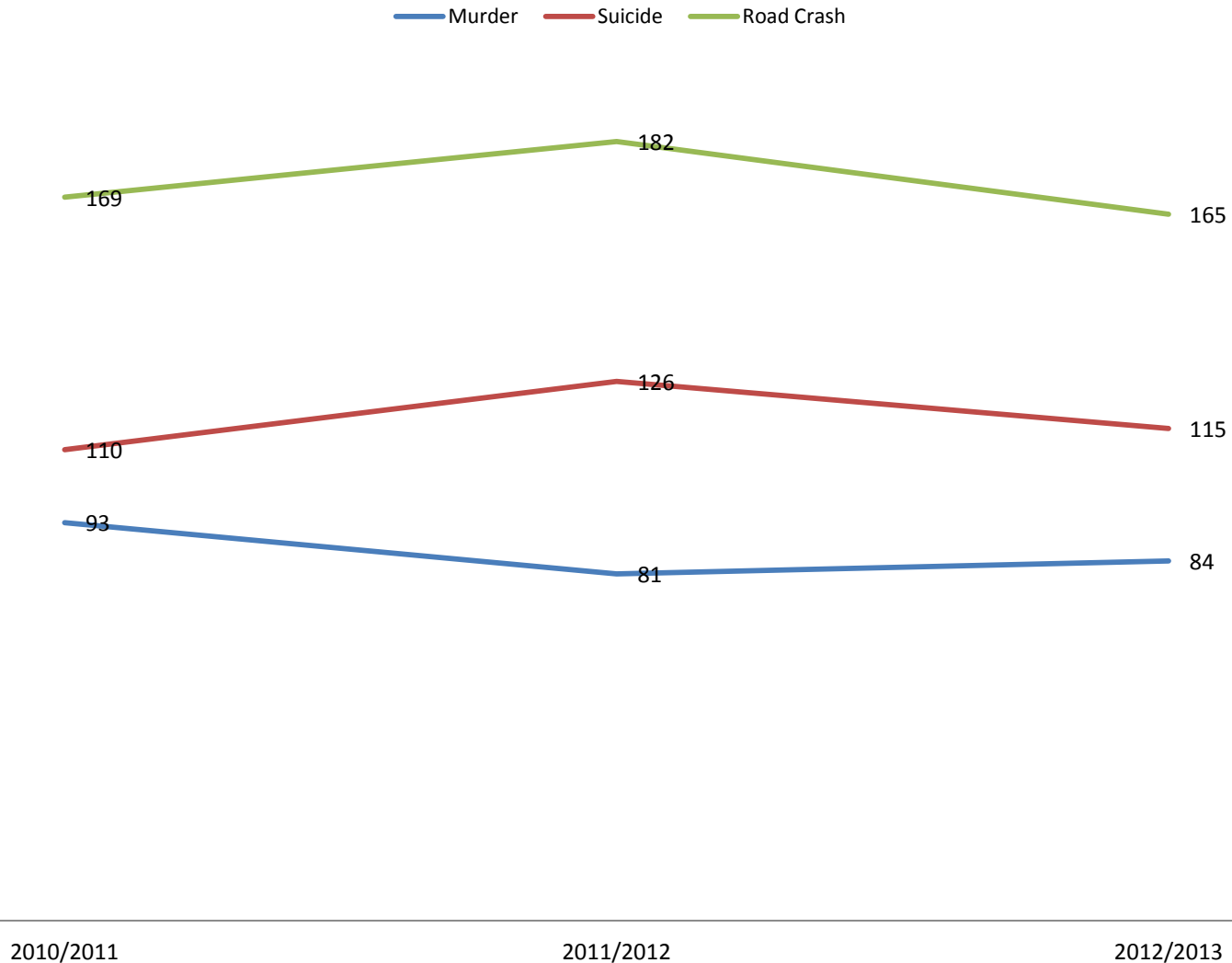
